

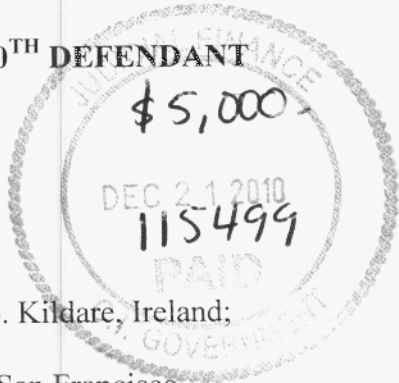

LET THE DEFENDANTS, within 28 days after service of this Summons on them, counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service to the Courts office, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

By this Summons, which is issued on the application of the plaintiff, Advantage Life & Annuity Company, SPC c/o Solomon Harris, Attorneys-at-law, 3rd Floor, FirstCaribbean House, P.O. Box 1990, Grand Cayman, KY1-1104, Cayman Islands, the plaintiff's claim against the defendants seeking the determination of the Court on the following questions and seeking the following relief:-

1. A declaration as to who are the contracting parties to the contract of life insurance issued by the plaintiff on or about 31 May 1999 under policy number ALIP9905-1003 (the "Policy").
2. Whether, on a true construction of the terms of the Policy, upon the death or dissolution of any Beneficiary (as that term is defined by the Policy), that Beneficiary's entitlement to a share of the Death Benefit (as that term is defined by the Policy) passes to:
 - 2.1. The relevant Beneficiary's heirs and/or successors (if any);
 - 2.2. The remaining Beneficiaries;
 - 2.3. The Furman Trust (through its trustee);
 - 2.4. The Jeffery Furman Insurance Trust (through its trustee); or
 - 2.5. Some other person or entity.
3. Whether, on a true construction of the terms of the Policy, the letter from Jeffery Furman (deceased) to the plaintiff dated 5 October 2010 constitutes a valid substitution of Beneficiaries under the terms of the Policy.
4. An order that the plaintiff's costs of this application be paid by the defendants and/or from the proceeds of the Death Benefit.

5. Such other orders as the Court deems just.

If any defendant does not acknowledge service, such judgment may be given or order made against or in relation to him as the Court may think just and expedient.
