ORIGINATING SUMMONS

LET THE RESPONDENTS of George Town, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands attend before the Judge in Chambers, at the Law Courts, George Town, Grand Cayman on the day of , 2011 at o'clock in the fore/afternoon on the hearing of an application by the Applicant, Theda Truman of P.O. Box 552, Grand Cayman KY1-1107, Personal Representative of the Estate of John Nelson Ramoon, deceased a beneficiary of the Estate of Hubert Nelson Ramoon, deceased, and herself a beneficiary of the Estate of John Nelson Ramoon for the following relief:-

1. That a determination be made of the value of the interest of the Estate of John Nelson Ramoon in the Estate of Hubert Nelson Ramoon.

2. That the Respondents within 30 days take such step or steps as are necessary to make a distribution to the Applicant as Representative of the Estate of John Nelson Ramoon from the assets of the Estate of Hubert Nelson Ramoon.
3. That the Respondents file an account of their administration and distribution of the Estate of Hubert Nelson Ramoon and to the extent relevant, the Estate of Mary Ann Ramoon.
4. Such further or other relief this Court deems just.
5. Cost of this application to be paid by the Respondents.

AND LET THE RESPONDENTS within 14 days after service of this summons on them counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service to the Courts Office.


The accompanying form of Acknowledgement of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495, Grand Cayman KY1-1106, George Town, Grand Cayman.

Notes for Guidance


1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgement of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)".
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
8. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian ad litem.
9. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.

Defendant in person: where the Defendant is acting in person, he must give his post office box number and the physical address of his residence or, if he does not reside in the Cayman Islands, he must give an address in Grand Cayman where communications for him should be sent. In the case of a limited company, "residence" means its registered principal office.

Indorsement by Plaintiff's attorney (or by Plaintiff if suing in person) of his name, address and reference, if any, in the box below.
