ORIGINATING SUMMONS

LET THE DEFENDANTS attend before the Judge in Chambers, at the Law Courts, George Town, Grand Cayman on the ..... day of ..... 2011 at ..... o'clock on the hearing of an application by the Plaintiff for Orders that:-

1. This Honourable Court hereby sanctions the variation/addition of section 75 of the Registered Land Law (2004 Revision) thereby permitting the Plaintiff to rely upon the terms of the charge executed by the Defendants and registered in the Land Registry 6 November 1998, as varied from time to time, (the "Charge") over the property registered as South Sound, Block 15 C, Parcel 205 ("the Property") including the power to sell the Property by private treaty (the "Power of Sale").
2. The Property be marketed for no less than three months (the "Marketing Period") at a price of not less than CI\$557,000 and that a minimum reserve price of CI\$446,000 (the "Minimum Reserve Price") be fixed in respect of the sale of the Property.
3. [ ] of [ ] (the "Realtor") shall have conduct of the sale of the Property in accordance with the Power of Sale.
4. The Defendants or the occupants of the Property shall co-operate with the Realtor in showing the Property upon a minimum of 24 hours' notice to the Defendants of a request for same.

5. After the Marketing Period and after any offer is accepted in respect of the Property pursuant to the Power of Sale, the Defendants or the occupants of the Property shall, if requested by the Plaintiff, immediately vacate the Property and take all appropriate steps to give the Plaintiff or purchaser of the Property vacant possession of the Property. If the Defendants or any other person occupying the Property do not vacate the Property upon such a request, the Plaintiff or purchaser of the Property shall thereafter be at liberty to enter the Property and take possession thereof. The Plaintiff is hereby granted leave to issue a Writ of Possession commanding the Bailiff to enter the Property and to cause the Plaintiff to have possession of it after the expiry of the Marketing Period and after the acceptance of any offer pursuant to the Order of Sale.
  
6. The proceeds of any sale of the Property in accordance with this Order shall be paid to the attorneys for the Plaintiff, Charles Adams Ritchie & Duckworth ("CARD"), on their undertaking that such proceeds shall be applied in the following order of priority: -
  - i. Payment of the Realtor's fees in respect of the sale of the Property;
  - ii. Payment of CARD's legal fees;
  - iii. Payment of all sums due to the Plaintiff from the Defendants including principal, interest and fees;
  - iv. Payment of the costs of these proceedings;
  - v. The balance of any sums remaining shall be paid to the Defendants.
  
7. The Minimum Reserve Price be kept confidential as between the parties hereto and the Realtor.
  
8. The Plaintiff be awarded its cost of this application from the proceeds of sale of the Property.
  
9. The Plaintiff be at liberty to apply to vary this Order.

**AND LET THE DEFENDANT** within 14 days after service of this Summons on him counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service to the Courts Office, PO Box 495, George Town, Grand Cayman, KY1-1106, Cayman Islands.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE  
FOR ORIGINATING SUMMONS**

The accompanying form of Acknowledgment of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, George Town, PO Box 495, Grand Cayman, KY1-1106, Cayman Islands.

1. Each Defendant (if there is more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgment of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)".
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
