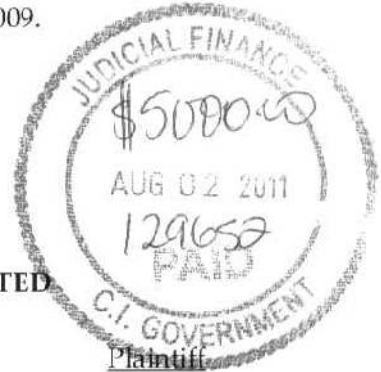

BY THIS ORIGINATING SUMMONS which is issued on the application of the Plaintiff, SUMMIT TRUSTEES (CAYMAN) LIMITED, of 4th Floor, Harbour Place, 103 South Church Street, Grand Cayman KY1-1102, Cayman Islands as Trustee of the Trust, against the Defendants (whose addresses are given above and who are interested under the Trust), seeks the following relief:

1. Directions as to what steps the Plaintiff should take, if any, in relation to Cause No. 6 of 2011 in the Grand Court of the Cayman Islands (“the Cayman Proceedings”).

2. If the Court directs that the Plaintiff defend the Cayman Proceedings through to trial, an order that the Plaintiff shall be authorised to:
 - (a) bring any incidental interlocutory applications including but not limited to an application for security for the Plaintiff's costs in the Cayman Proceedings, and to take all necessary steps and file such further pleadings and evidence as the Plaintiff is advised by its Cayman counsel; and
 - (b) to meet the costs of the steps taken in paragraph 1(a) of this Summons on an indemnity basis out of the income and/or capital of the Trust or as the Court otherwise deems appropriate.
3. That the costs of this application be raised and paid on an indemnity basis out of the income and/or capital of the Trust, or as the Court otherwise deems appropriate.
4. All further and necessary orders and directions as this Honourable Court shall think fit, including, if necessary, directions as to any necessary representation orders and service of these proceedings.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF SERVICE
OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS**

The accompanying form of Acknowledgement of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgment of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)".
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.

6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
