THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within 14 days after the service of the Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim of return to the Court Office, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgement may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

NOTE: - This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is require to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of issue renewed by order of the Court.

GENERAL INDORSEMENT

The Plaintiff is the Landlord of property known as the Grand Pavilion Commercial Centre located on the West Bay Road, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands and the Defendant was a tenant from 26th April 2010 until 31st March 2011.

The Plaintiff claims for damages resulting from the Defendant's refusal to pay rent for the use of 77,000 square feet of the Grand Pavilion Commercial Center and pursuant to the terms of lease agreement dated 26th April 2010 and accrued interest on the said unpaid rent to date.

The Defendant moved out of jurisdiction with only an email contact address and a Cayman Islands post office box address.

Numerous requests via telephone and emails for payments have been made by the Plaintiff. A Letter Before Action was duly emailed to the Defendant by the Plaintiff's Attorney on 2nd May 2011 and was also delivered registered via mail address on by the Plaintiff.

The Defendant has not responded and has made no attempts to settle the unpaid debt. The Defendant currently has an outstanding debt of CI\$64,342.86 equivalent to USD78,466.90.

AND THE PLAINTIFF claims:

1. The sum of CI\$64,342.86 or equivalent in USD78,466.90;
2. Interest on the sum of USD78,466.90 pursuant to Section 34 of the Judicature Law (2007 Revision) at the rate of 5 ½ % per annum or at such other rate as may be prescribed under the said Law from the date of Judgment or sooner; and
3. Costs.

If within the time for returning the Acknowledgment of Service, the Defendant pays the total amount claimed of CI\$64,342.86 equivalent to USD78,466.90 (including interest and costs) further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the Plaintiff or his Attorney.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICES
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS

1. The accompanying form of acknowledgment of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person.

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgment of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings must also serve a defence on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statements of Claim" appear on the top of page 2) the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgement is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgement against him without further notice.

3. A Stay of Execution against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgment of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgment, but he must, within that time, issue a Summons for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by instalments or otherwise.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there is more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Writ of Summons)"
4. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....) after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorized to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian ad litem.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
