If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgement may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

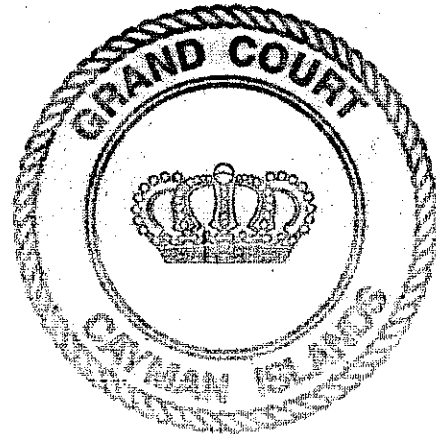

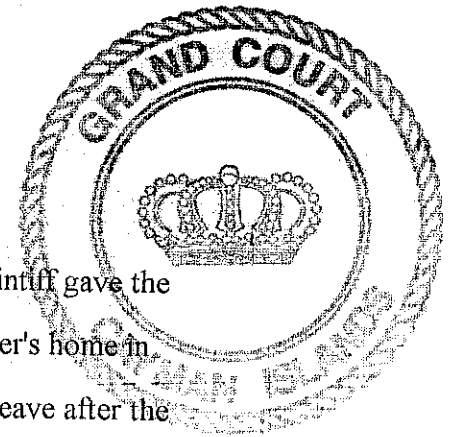

STATEMENT OF CLAIM



1. On the 13th day of February, 1997 at about 8:30 p.m. the plaintiff gave the defendant a lift in her car from Morgan's Harbour to his mother's home in Batabano. On reaching the home, the plaintiff attempted to leave after the defendant exited the car, but before she could do so, the defendant jumped back into the car, tried to restrain her from leaving and assaulted the plaintiff.
2. The defendant forced his fingers in the plaintiff's mouth and held the corners of her jaws and attempted to tear them apart; he wrestled with the plaintiff as she tried to drive to the police station, causing her to jump from the said motor car in fear.
3. By reason of the matters aforesaid, the plaintiff suffered pain and injury, loss and damage.

2. Bruises to her legs, arms and chest; and
3. Injuries to the inside of her mouth and damage to one tooth.

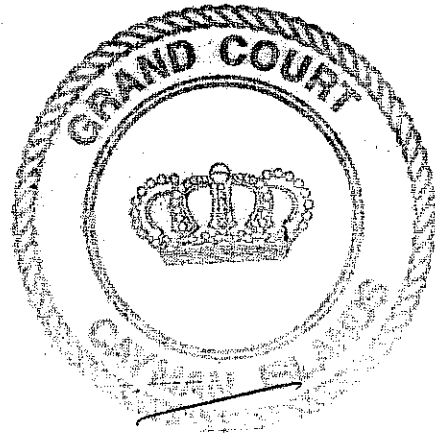
