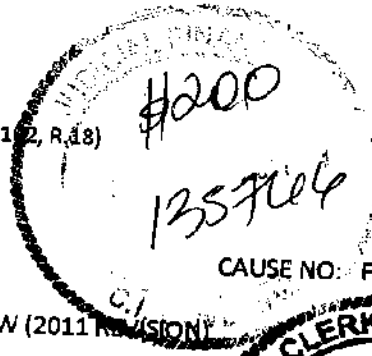

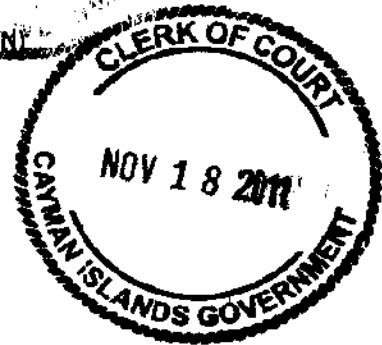


The petition of **Gregory Robert Brooks** shows that:

1. Cayman Dental Clinic Limited ("the Company") was incorporated on 10th February 2006 and registered (registration no. 162406) on 13th February 2006 under the Companies Law.
2. The last known registered office of the Company was at Caribbean Management Ltd, PO Box 1044, 5th Floor Bermuda House, Dr. Roy's Drive, Cayman Islands. The Company provided dental services in Grand Cayman.
3. The Company was struck off the register of companies on 30th June 2011.
4. The amount of the reinstatement fee payable upon restoring the Company to the register of companies has been requested from the Registrar of Companies and will be confirmed in due course.
5. The petitioner has a claim against the Company for personal injuries loss and damage arising out of negligent treatment and advice in respect of the extraction of the petitioner's wisdom teeth on 4th April 2008. The relevant Cause number of those proceedings is CIV 115 of 2011 and a writ and statement of claim were filed on 1st April 2011. The Company is named as the second defendant in those proceedings.
6. In and around March 2008 a dentist employed by the Company advised the Petitioner that he required a surgical extraction of his wisdom teeth and referred him for surgery at George Town Hospital with a Dr. Castellano. At no stage was a pre-operative consultation carried out with the Petitioner and at no stage was he advised of any risks associated with the surgery by any servant or agent of the Company or by any of the other named Defendants in the proceedings or their servants or agents. There was therefore no informed consent to the operation and the Petitioner was only asked to sign a consent form post surgery. As a result of the surgery the Petitioner suffered left lingual nerve neuropraxia resulting in loss of sensation on one side of his tongue and the Injury has impeded on his speech.
7. In the circumstances, it is just and equitable that the Company be restored to the register of companies to enable service of the petitioner's Writ and Statement of Claim to be effected upon the Company.

The petitioner therefore prays that:

- i) the Company be restored to the register of companies;
- ii) such other order or directions may be made as the Court thinks fit.
