
LET THE RESPONDENT attend before a Judge in Chambers, at the law Courts, George Town, Grand Cayman, on the day of 2012, at o'clock in the fore/ afternoon on the hearing of an application by the Applicant, whose address is c/o Brooks & Brooks, Two Artillery Court, Shedden Road, George Town, Grand Cayman, for the following:-

1. A declaration that he is a rehabilitated person as defined by the Rehabilitation of Offenders Law (1998 Revision).
2. A declaration that the convictions recorded against him under Information Nos. 2485 / 06 (1-4) are spent.
3. That he is entitled to receive a record from the Royal Cayman Islands Police \ Criminal Records Office, a record reflecting these spent convictions.
4. Any other and further relief as this Honourable Court deems just.
5. That the Respondent do pay the costs of this application.

6. Any further or other relief as this Honourable Court deems just.

AND LET THE RESPONDENT within 14 days after service of this Originating Summons on him counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service form to the Court Office.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a **FIRM** and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a **PARTNER** by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual **TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN**, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a **LIMITED COMPANY** the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on his behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a **MINOR** or a **MENTAL PATIENT**, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.

NOTES ON ADDRESS FOR SERVICE

Attorney: Where the Respondent is represented by an Attorney, state the Attorney's place of business in the Cayman Islands. A Respondent may not act by a foreign Attorney.

Respondent in person: Where the Respondent is acting in person, he must give his post office box number and the physical address of his residence, or if he does not reside in the Cayman Islands, he must give an address in Grand Cayman where communications for him should be sent.
