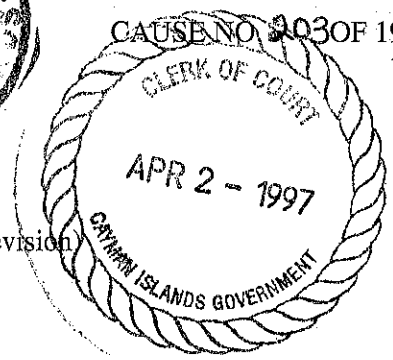

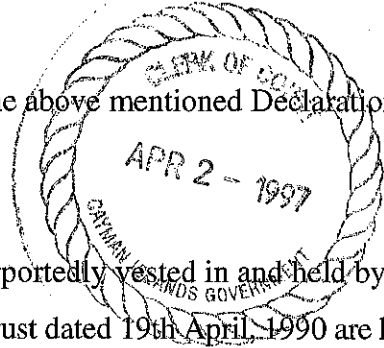

By this Originating Summons, which is issued on the application of Barclays Private Bank & Trust (Cayman) Limited of Barclays House, P.O. Box 487, George Town, Grand Cayman as the trustee of the trusts established by the above mentioned Declaration of Trust dated 19th April, 1990 and known as the Faygate Trust, the Plaintiff seeks the following relief:-

1. That it may be determined whether the trusts declared in the above mentioned Declaration of Trust dated 19th April, 1990 are valid or void.
2. That it may be determined whether the assets vested or purportedly vested in and held by the Plaintiff as trustee of the above mentioned Declaration of Trust dated 19th April, 1990 are held upon the trusts declared therein (if valid) or on some other trusts and if so what trusts.
3. That all other further and necessary directions may be given.
4. That the costs of the Plaintiff be paid on an indemnity basis out of the said assets vested or purportedly vested in and held by the Plaintiff and that such further or other provision may be made for costs as the Court shall think fit.
5. Further and other relief.



IF the Defendants do not acknowledge service, such judgment may be given or order made against or in relation to them as the Court may think just and expedient.
