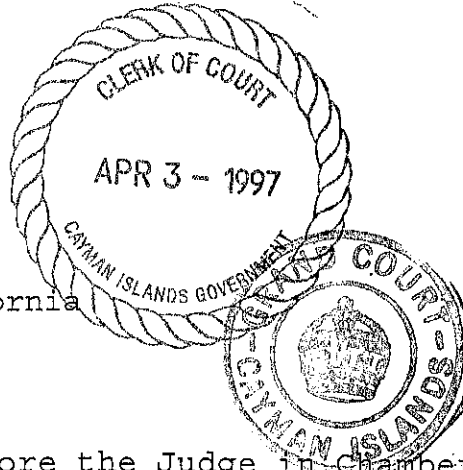

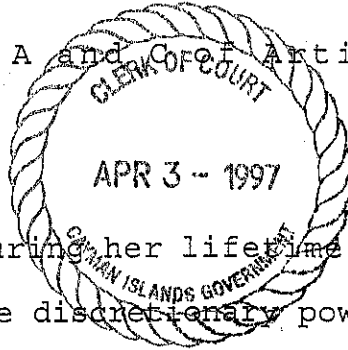
LET THE DEFENDANTS attend before the Judge in Chambers, at the Law Courts, George Town, Grand Cayman on the ..... day of *June* ..... 1997, at *9:30* o'clock on the hearing of an Application by the Plaintiff of Ansbacher House, P.O. Box 500GT, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands, British West Indies as Trustee of the above-mentioned trust ("the Trust") by which the Applicant seeks the following relief under Section 45 of the Trusts Law (Revised):-

1. THAT it may be determined whether, upon the true construction of the Trust Indenture dated 17th December, 1985 (the "Trust Indenture") and in the events which have happened:

(a) Barbara Young ("Barbara") is a Beneficiary for the purpose of paragraph A of Article VI of the Trust Indenture,

(b) Barbara is the "Settlor's Spouse" mentioned in paragraphs A and C of Article VI of the Trust Indenture,

(c) Barbara is during her lifetime an object, or the only object, of the discretionary power created by paragraph A of Article VI of the Trust Indenture;

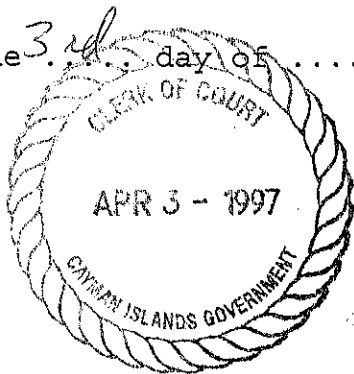



2. THAT such directions as this Honourable Court shall think fit may be given concerning the objections which have been made by or on behalf of the Second, Third and Fourth Defendants to the making of distributions to Barbara;
3. THAT the Plaintiff be authorised to seek and obtain legal advice in connection with proceedings commenced in California described in the First Affidavit of Garry Crossan filed herein.
4. THAT all further and necessary directions may be given.

5. THAT provision may be made for the costs of this Application;

AND LET THE DEFENDANTS within 14 days after service of this Summons on him counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service to the Court's Office.
