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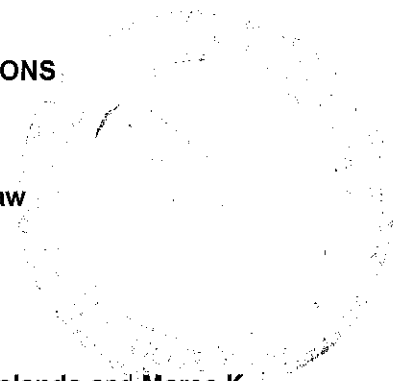

Application to be Admitted as an Attorney-at-Law


A. And I the said **Hilary Brooks** for myself do say that:-


- (1) I am one and the same person named as clerk in the Articles of Clerkship bearing the date 23<sup>rd</sup> day of **September 2010** with effect from the 1<sup>st</sup> day of **November 2010** with **Maree K. Martin** now produced and shown to me marked with the letter "A".
- (2) The said Articles of Clerkship were registered pursuant to Regulation 17 of the Legal Practitioners (Students) Regulations (2010 Revision) on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of **October 2010** with effect from the 1<sup>st</sup> day of **November 2010**.

- (4) The said **Hilary Brooks** is a fit and proper person to be admitted as an attorney-at-law.



**THESE ARTICLES OF CLERKSHIP** are made this <sup>22<sup>nd</sup></sup> day of September, 2010.

**BETWEEN:** Maree Martin of P.O. Box 2681, Grand Cayman  
KY1-1111, Cayman Islands,  
Maree.martin@conyersdill.com (the  
"Principal") of the One Part

**AND:** Hilary Brooks of 18 Sunrise Phase II, P.O. Box  
31494, Grand Cayman KY1-1206, Cayman  
Islands, hilsbrooks@mac.com (the "Articled  
Clerk") of the Other Part

**WITNESS** as follows:

- 1) The Principal hereby takes the Articled Clerk as her clerk for the period of eighteen months from 1 November, 2010 (the "Term") (or as extended by periods of absence for annual leave or other approved leave).
- 2) The Articled Clerk binds herself to the Principal to serve the Principal for the Term.
- 3) The Articled Clerk covenants with the Principal as follows:
  - a) Honestly, diligently, and faithfully and to the best of her ability to serve the Principal throughout the Term as the Principal's articled clerk in the profession of an attorney-at-law.
  - b) Not at any time to deal improperly with the money or property of the Principal or of his firm or of any of his or their clients or employees which shall be deposited in his or their hands or entrusted to the custody of him or them.
  - c) At all times during the Term to readily obey and execute the lawful and reasonable instructions of the Principal and his designated instructors and except as otherwise in these Articles provided not to absent herself from the service and employment of the Principal at any time during the Term without the consent of the Principal and at all times during the Term to conduct herself with all due diligence, honesty and propriety and to truly and honestly serve the Principal during the Term as a faithful Articled Clerk ought.
  - d) To take all reasonable and proper care to prevent the Principal from sustaining any loss or damage or prejudice by the misbehaviour, neglect or improper conduct of the Articled Clerk.

- e) In the event of secondment for training outside of the Principal's firm, to meet the standards and obligations in 3(a)-(d) herein in relation to the attorney-at-law serving as instructor.

4) The Principal covenants with the Articled Clerk as follows:

- a) To accept and take the Articled Clerk as her clerk and to the best of her ability to teach and instruct the Articled Clerk or cause her to be taught and instructed by the instructors employed in the practice and profession in such manner as the Principal now practices or may during the Term practice (and where prudent to second the Articled Clerk for instruction) and to provide the Articled Clerk with the opportunity to learn and assimilate the basic skills and characteristics associated with the practice and profession of an attorney-at-law and in particular to:
  - (i) Provide the Articled Clerk with the opportunity of assimilating the principles of professional conduct and etiquette and to learn by practice the following basic skills:-
    - (1) Drafting and legal writing;
    - (2) Interviewing and oral communication;
    - (3) Research and analysis;
    - (4) Office administration, routines, procedures, accounts and practice management;
    - (5) Ethics; and
    - (6) negotiation and problem solving.
  - (ii) Give the Articled Clerk the opportunity of being involved in legal work in the following fields of law:-
    - (1) Commercial, Corporate, Funds and Finance;
    - (2) Litigation; and
    - (3) Trust, Wills and Succession, and Conveyance.
- (b) To use all reasonable endeavours to ensure that each calendar month either she or another person delegated by her for the purpose will be available to discuss informally with the Articled Clerk such general points as may have arisen thus far during the Term.

(c) Approximately every three months to provide an assessment of the progress of the Articled Clerk.

5) The Articled Clerk's salary and other benefits shall be as provided for by a letter of engagement dated 21st September, 2010 between the Articled Clerk and the firm of Conyers Dill and Pearman, and any terms therein shall be read subject to this agreement.

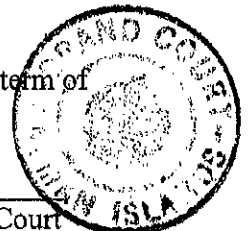
