*If you fail to satisfy the claim or return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgement may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.*

**STATEMENT OF CLAIM**

1. The Plaintiff is a Registered Company pursuant to the Company Law of the Cayman Islands with its Registered Office situate at the offices of Adriannie Webb, Attorney-at-Law, Second Floor (South East Wing) Cayman Shipping Centre Building, 10 Shipping Lane, George Town, Grand Cayman, Cayman islands.
2. The Plaintiff was at all times engaged in the business of selling and supplying building cement to its customers.
3. The Plaintiff, at all material times, sold and supplied building cement to its customers on credit.
4. The Defendant was at all material times a customer of the Plaintiff and operated from premises situate at 53 Bernard Drive, George Town, Grand Cayman.
5. The Defendant applied for and was granted credit facilities by the Plaintiff to purchase building cement and material from the Plaintiff.
6. Pursuant to the said grant the Defendant purchased on credit and the Plaintiff supplied to the First Defendant building cement and material in the total sum of CI\$16,849.50 between the 30<sup>th</sup> April 2010 and the 13<sup>th</sup> June 2010.
7. It was a term of the said credit granted to the Defendant that a service charge of 2% computed on a monthly basis would be charged to any unpaid balance that remained owing after 30 days of the grant to the Defendant.
8. Save and except for a payment of CI\$4,000.00 on or about the 21<sup>st</sup> day of January 2011 the Defendant has failed to make any other payment in respect of the cement and material purchased and supplied to under the said credit arrangements between the parties.
9. That in the circumstances the Defendants remain indebted to the Plaintiff, individually and collectively and the Plaintiff has accordingly sustained loss and damage.

The Debt attracts an interest of 2% computed on a monthly basis in respect of any unpaid balance on the Principal Sum

1. The outstanding credit balance of CI\$6,583.50
2. Accumulated Interest thereon at the contractual rate of CI\$19.122.37
3. Interest thereafter at 24% per annum
4. Costs.

If, within the time for returning the Acknowledgement of Service, the Defendant pays the total amount claimed of \$26,196.35 (including interest and cost) further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the Plaintiff or their Attorneys-at-Law.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE  
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person.  
After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P. O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.
2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgment of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).  
If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.  
If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.  
If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.
3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgment of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgment, but he must, within that time, *issue a Summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by instalments or otherwise.

## Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
