1. Guardianship over of Arnie Arrendale Ewen an adult with diminished mental capabilities in place of the Respondent.
2. be allowed to relocate Arnie Arrendale Ewen Florida, United States, and;
 - i. provide the required consent for an on behalf of Arnie for any medical treatment/procedure he may require now, and all follow up medical procedures which may become necessary in the future;
 - ii. sign any documentation whether medical or legal necessary for his treatment or any other need that may arise;
 - iii. sign/execute any documentation/instructions in relation to his financial affairs, whether in the Cayman Islands or the United States;
 - iv. hire any nursing or home care assistant to assists me with his care as and when required;
 - v. pay any salaries, expenses, hospital and medical charges relating to services or treatment provided to him;
 - vi. to carry out and execute any and all other necessary or required action/instructions or decision which I consider necessary for his well being and care.
3. Directions as to the manner of service on the Respondent, an adult with diminished mental capabilities.

4. Such further directions as this Honourable Court may deem appropriate.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS

The accompanying form of Acknowledgment of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgment of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)".
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
8. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian ad litem.
9. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
