ORIGINATING SUMMONS


LET THE DEFENDANTS Kaedi Elena Robinson and Ruby Robinson of #20 Hope Springs, George Town, Grand Cayman attend before the Judge in Chambers, at the Law Courts, George Town, Grand Cayman on the day 2014, at o'clock on the hearing of this summons issued by the Plaintiffs of c/o Samson & McGrath, 5th Floor wherein the Plaintiffs seek the following relief and Orders, namely,

1. The plaintiffs obtained judgment against the defendants in Summary Court Cause 142 of 2012 on the 23rd October 2012.
2. In order to enforce the judgment debt the plaintiff obtained a charging order absolute over property George Town South, Block 14D Parcel 99H37 ("the property") by order of the Summary Court dated 7th June 2013.
3. Pursuant to the right conferred by GCR Order 50 r8(2) the plaintiffs exercised their power of sale by listing the property for sale by public auction on the 31st October 2013.
4. Subsequent to listing the property the defendants have refused to co-operate with the Real Estate Agent tasked with selling the property by refusing to allow access to the property to prospective purchasers.
5. By virtue of Section 34 of the Summary Jurisdiction Law and Summary Court Rule 14, GCR Orders 31 and 45 are not available to the plaintiff in the Summary Court and the plaintiff seeks the following Orders of the Grand Court;
 1. That the defendants and every other person in actual occupation of George Town South, Block 14D Parcel 99H37 do give up possession of the property within 28 days of the service of this Order upon them.

2. That the plaintiffs are given leave to issue a Writ of Possession with respect to the property should the property not be vacated within 28 days of the date of service of this Order upon them.

AND LET THE DEFENDANTS within 14 days after service of this summons on them counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service to the Courts office.

NOTES:-

- (1) This Summons may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the above date unless renewed by order of the Court.
- (2) If a defendant does not attend personally or by his attorney at the time and place above-mentioned such order will be made as the Court may think just and expedient.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE
OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS

The accompanying form of Acknowledgment of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgment of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)".
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
8. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian ad litem.
9. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.


Notes on address for service

Attorney: where the Defendant is represented by an attorney, state the attorney's place of business in the Cayman Islands. A Defendant may not act by a foreign attorney.


