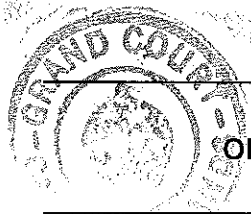
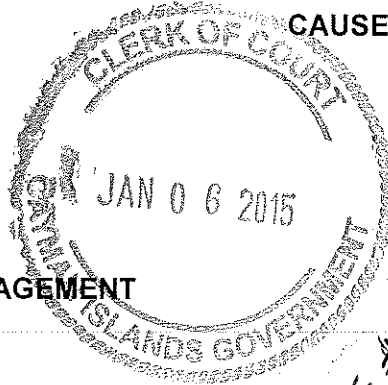

BY THIS SUMMONS, which is issued on the application of Felix Fischer of Lechelstr. 80, 80997 Munich, Germany, the Plaintiff claims against the Defendants:

- 1 An order that the First Defendant provide the Plaintiff with the following documents:
 - 1.1 The final, signed version of the First Defendant's 2012 annual accounts.
 - 1.2 The final versions of the First Defendant's budgets for each financial year since inception, up to and including the budget for 2014.

THIS ORIGINATING SUMMONS was issued by Maples and Calder, attorneys for the Plaintiff, whose address for service is PO Box 309, Ugland House, Grand Cayman, KY1-1104, Cayman Islands. (Ref: JSE/KKW/693681.000001/34790536)

- 1.3 The First Defendant's quarterly management accounts up to and including the first and third quarter of 2014.
- 2 An order that the Second Defendant provide the Plaintiff with the following documents:
 - 2.1 The quarterly accounts and management accounts of Sango Capital Partners LP from its inception, as are in the Second Defendant's possession, custody, or power.
 - 2.2 The Second Defendant's quarterly management accounts:
 - (a) from inception, up to and including the fourth quarter of 2013; and
 - (b) for the third quarter of 2014.
- 3 An order that the First Defendant provides the Plaintiff with the following documents and/or information on an on-going basis, until otherwise agreed between the Plaintiff and First Defendant or otherwise ordered by the Court:
 - 3.1 The annual accounts of the First Defendant for each financial year, within six months of the end of the relevant financial year in question;
 - 3.2 Budgets for the First Defendant for each financial year at least 30 days before the start of the financial year in question;
 - 3.3 Quarterly management accounts of the First Defendant (such accounts to include, inter alia, a consolidated profit and loss account, balance sheet and cash flow statement) within 20 days from the end of each calendar quarter;
 - 3.4 Quarterly directors' reports of activities including investment decisions made, disposals or realisations made within 20 days from the end of each calendar quarter; and
 - 3.5 Any material information which has a bearing on the conduct of the business of the First Defendant within 20 days of such information first coming to the attention of any Director.
- 4 An order that the Second Defendant provides the Plaintiff with the following documents within 7 days of such documents coming into existence, until otherwise agreed between the Plaintiff and First Defendant or otherwise ordered by the Court:

- 4.1 The quarterly and audited accounts of the Second Defendant and of Sango Capital Partnership LP (as may be in CIP LP's possession, custody or power);
- 4.2 The quarterly and audited management accounts of the Second Defendant, which must include at least:
- (a) a balance sheet;
 - (b) a profit and loss account;
 - (c) a statement of the amount of the income account and capital account for each Partner; and
 - (d) a summary of the movements in such accounts together with a statement showing distributions to the Partners.

5 An order that the Defendants do pay the Plaintiff's costs of this proceeding.

If the Defendants do not acknowledge service, such judgment may be given or order made against or in relation to them as the Court may think just and expedient.

Notes for Guidance

1.

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgment of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.

4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)".
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
