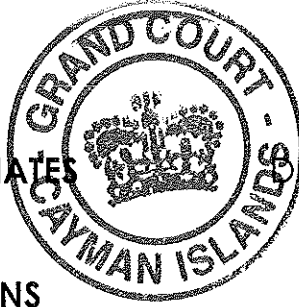
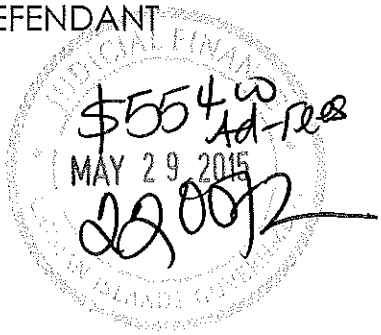
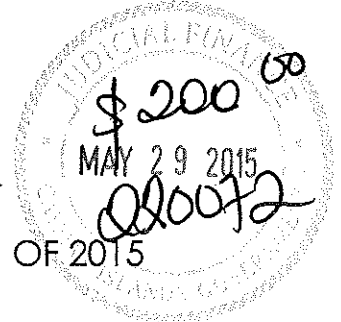

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page. Within [14 days] after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgment within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgment without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.


## STATEMENT OF CLAIM

In April of both 2013 and 2014, the Plaintiff personally took a cheque payable to the Defendant, and caused his former employer Sagicor Insurance Managers, to forward to the Defendant, on the Plaintiff's behalf, together, a total of CI55, 350. 00 for the purpose of paying to the Cayman Islands Government, the fees required for the Plaintiff to obtain his Residency and Employment Rights Certificates for the years 2013-14 and 2014-15. The monies were never paid to the Cayman Islands Government on his behalf. On or about 14 December 2014, the Plaintiff was contacted by Debt Collection for Immigration about the potential consequence of nonpayment. The Plaintiff who had been unaware that the Defendant had not paid the required fees of CI 55, 350.00, paid the sum to avoid the consequences of nonpayment.

AND THE PLAINTIFF claims:

1. CI55, 350. 00
2. And the Plaintiff claims for interest @ 3% CI1798. 00
3. Fixed costs for CI2, 305. 00

If, within the time for returning the Acknowledgment of Service, the Defendant pays the total amount claimed of CI59, 454.00 further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to his Attorney C/O the address below

**Acknowledgement of service of writ of summons (0.12, r.3)**

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE  
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS**

1. The accompanying form of Acknowledgment of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.
2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgment of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings must also serve a defence on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).
3. If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.
4. If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.
5. If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.
6. A Stay of Execution against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgment of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgment, but he must, within that time, issue a Summons for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by installments or otherwise.

In the case of a limited company, "residence" means its registered or principal office.
