Within 14 days after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O. Box 495, George Town, Grand Cayman KY1-1106, the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgment within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgment without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. The Plaintiff is a Cayman Islands Class "A" Licensed bank ("the Bank"), duly authorized under the laws of the Cayman Islands to, *inter alia*, offer retail banking facilities to its customers.
2. The Defendant is an individual who at all material times was a resident in the Cayman Islands.
3. Following the Defendant's request for a loan, on 19 May 2010, the Defendant signed a promissory note where the Defendant promised to pay to the Bank on demand the sum of CI\$100,000.00 with interest thereon calculated and payable monthly at a rate equal to the Bank's personal loan base rate of 10% per annum ("the Promissory Note").
4. Upon signing the Promissory Note, a loan was advanced and established in a loan account, account number 3316029 ("Loan Account").
5. Payment under the terms of the Loan fell into arrears and on 10 June 2015, the Bank, through its attorneys, made formal demand for the immediate payment of the total amount outstanding under the Loan Account, together with accrued interest to the date of payment.
6. No payments have been received from the Defendant since 26 June 2015 in relation to the Loan Account.
7. As at 29 June 2015 the debt outstanding under the Loan Account amounted to CI\$85,509.51 including interest which is accruing at the per annum rate of 10%.

8. The Bank is entitled to and claims interest on the Loan.


STATEMENT REGARDING INTEREST

- 8.1. It was a provision of the agreement in relation to the Loan Account that interest would accrue.
- 8.2. The agreed rate of interest in respect of the Loan Account was 10%
- 8.3. Interest was payable from the date the Loan Account was made being 19 May 2010.
- 8.4. The amount of interest accruing due each day thereafter is CI\$23.31.

AND THE PLAINTIFF claims:

1. The sum of CI\$85,066.70;
2. Interest to 29 June 2015 on the Loan Account totalling CI\$442.81 and accruing thereafter at the daily rate of CI\$23.31 until payment;
3. Costs; and
4. Such further and/or other relief as this Honourable Court deems appropriate.

If, within the time for returning the Acknowledgment of Service, the Defendant pays the total amount claimed of CI\$85,509.81 plus further accruing interest and costs further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the Plaintiff or its Attorney.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE

OF WRIT OF SUMMONS

1. The accompanying form of Acknowledgment of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person.

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgment of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings must also serve a defence on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A Stay of Execution against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgment of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgment, but he must, within that time, issue a Summons for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by instalments or otherwise.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Writ of Summons)".
4. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian ad litem.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
