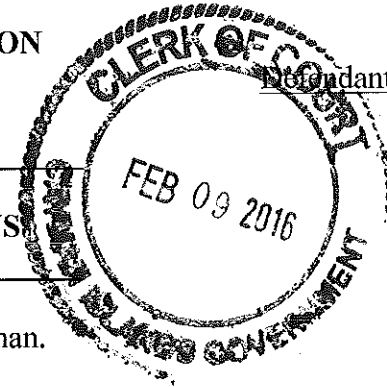

LET THE RESPONDENT, within 14 days after service of this Summons on her, counting day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service to the Courts Office, PO Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

By this Summons, which is issued on the application of Linval Roy Wellington, of George Town, Grand Cayman, the Applicant claims against the Respondent: -

1. An Order pursuant to Section 39 of the Limitation Law (1996 Revision) that the provision of Section 13 of the Limitation Law (1996 Revision) shall not apply to the Plaintiff's cause of action and that cause no. G0180 of 2015 be allowed to proceed.
2. That costs of and occasioned by this application be awarded to the Plaintiff.
3. Such further or other relief as this Honourable Court may deem appropriate.

This Originating Summons was issued by Broadhurst LLC, whose address for service is 40 Linwood Street, Georgetown, PO Box 2503 KY1-1104 Cayman Islands.

If the Respondent does not acknowledge service, such judgment may be given or order made against or in relation to her as the Court may think just and expedient.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF SERVICE
OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS**

The accompanying form of Acknowledgment of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Court Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial matter) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgment of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. When the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)".
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step on the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.

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8. Where the Defendant is MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian ad litem.
9. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
