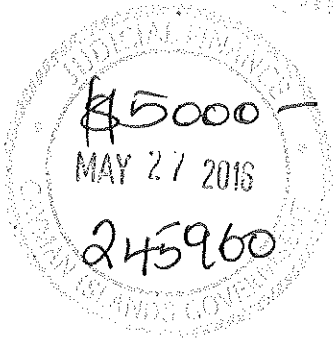

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above named Plaintiff in respect  
of the claim set out on the next page.

Within 14 days after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either  
satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O. Box 495GT, George Town, Grand Cayman,  
the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest  
these proceedings.


If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if  
you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the

proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgement may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

AND THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS:

1. A declaration that the Resolution of the First Defendant purporting to authorize payments to the Second Defendant is not valid;
2. an inquiry as to what salary, performance fee or sale proceeds have been paid to the Second Defendant by reason of the above-mentioned Resolution;
3. an order for payment to the First Defendant of such sums as shall be found upon the taking of the said inquiry;
4. damages for breach of contract and breach of fiduciary duty;
5. an order for payment to the First Defendant of interest on the said sums at such a rate and for such period as the court shall think fit;
6. such further consequential or other accounts or inquiries as may be necessary or requisite;
7. the Plaintiff's costs;
8. such other and further relief as the Court may deem just and proper.
