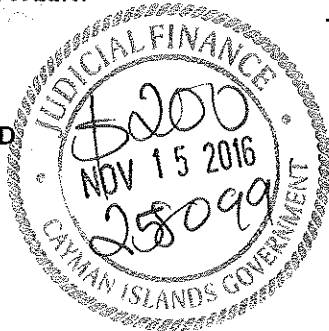

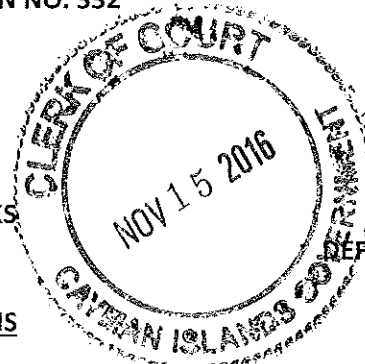

ORIGINATING SUMMONS

**LET THE DEFENDANTS** Janice A Dixon and Allen Kennedy Ebanks of Apartment #2 La Serenidad, Block and Parcel 27D 203H2, Grand Cayman attend before the Judge in Chambers, at the Law Courts, George Town, Grand Cayman on the \_\_\_\_\_ day \_\_\_\_\_ 2016, at \_\_\_\_\_ o'clock on the hearing of this summons issued by the Plaintiffs of c/o Samson & McGrath, 5<sup>th</sup> Floor wherein the Plaintiffs seek the following relief and Orders pursuant to GCR Orders 30, 31 and 45, namely;

1. That Bye-law 4.3.4 of the registered bye-laws of the plaintiff be specifically performed and carried into execution.
2. That pursuant to Order 31 r 1 of the GCR that the Plaintiff has liberty to sell property Savannah, Block and Parcel 27D 203H2.
3. That the defendant and every other person in actual occupation of Savannah, Block and Parcel 27D 203H2 do give up possession of the property to the plaintiff within 28 days of the service of this Order upon them.
3. That the plaintiffs are given leave to issue a Writ of Possession with respect to the property should the property not be vacated within 28 days of the date of service of this Order upon them.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that the grounds of this application are as set out in the affidavit of Michael Baulk filed alongside this Summons:

AND LET THE DEFENDANT within 14 days after service of this summons on them counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service to the Courts office.

- (1) This Summons may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the above date unless renewed by order of the Court.
- (2) If a defendant does not attend personally or by his attorney at the time and place above-mentioned such order will be made as the Court may think just and expedient.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE  
OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS

The accompanying form of Acknowledgment of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

**Notes for Guidance**

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgment of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)".
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
8. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian ad litem.
9. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
