EXPARTE ORIGINATING SUMMONS

LET ALL PARTIES CONCERNED attend before a Judge in Chambers, at the Law Courts, George Town, Grand Cayman on the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of November 2016 at 11:00 AM o'clock in the forenoon/afternoon on the hearing of an application by the Co-Petitioners, who seek the determination of the Court on the following question, namely an Order:

1. That the Petitioners be appointed jointly and severally, acting together or alone, as the guardian of the said Respondent Albert Eduardo Bodden ("Patient") and over his estate and effects with the following power conferred upon the Guardian:
  - (a) To control and manage any property of the Patient;
  - (b) To sell, acquire, charge or otherwise dispose of or deal with any real property of the Patient;
  - (c) To invest the proceeds of sale or any other monies belonging to the Patient in such securities as the Guardian for the time being is authorised by law to invest trust funds.

- (d) To deposit into and withdraw from any account at any bank or lending Institution in the Cayman Islands and elsewhere such of the patient's monies as may be necessary for the proper maintenance and care of the Patient.
  - (e) To make decisions as to all health and general welfare matters with respect to the Patient.
2. That the Co-Petitioners and each of them shall keep proper accounts of the administration and management of the property of the Patient and whenever required by the Court to do so shall file in Court copies of such accounts.
  3. That the cost of this application and cost of the guardian incidental to and consequent upon the Order shall be paid from the estate and property of the Patient if any.
