THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within 14 days after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, PO Box 495, Grand Cayman, KY1-1106, Cayman Islands, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

NOTE – This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.

STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. The Plaintiff is and was at all material times a Bank organised and carrying on business pursuant to the laws of the Cayman Islands. The Plaintiff's address for service is care of its attorneys, HSM Chambers, 68 For Street, PO Box 31726, George Town, Grand Cayman, KY1-1207, Cayman Islands.
2. The Defendant is an individual who resides in the Cayman Islands with a mailing address of PO Box 31187, Grand Cayman KY1-1205, Cayman Islands.
3. Pursuant to a commitment letter dated 27 November 2008, Plaintiff agreed to loan to the Defendant the sum of CI\$128,350 plus interest thereon at 1% above the Bank's Prime Lending rate for Cayman Island Dollars to be repaid by way of monthly instalments of CI\$1,220 over a 12 year terms ("the Loan").
4. The Loan was secured by a first legal charge dated 6 January 2006 registered against the property known and situate as Unit 3, Groveside Apartments, George Town, Block 20E, Parcel 248H3 ("the Property") on or around 27 January 2009 ("the Legal Charge") .
5. It was an express term of the Legal Charge that the Defendant agreed, inter alia, the following:

"(2)(a) The term, repayment dated, monthly payments and other terms of this Charge are set out in the commitment letter between the Chargor and the Chargee dated 27 November 2008 (the "Commitment") as amended from time to time. In the event of any conflict between the terms of this Charge and the Commitment, the terms of this Commitment shall prevail.

...

3(b) Pending such demand for payment as aforesaid by the Chargee the Chargor shall pay to the Chargee such monthly sums as the Chargee shall from time to time specify which said sums shall be applied by the Chargee first in payment of interest from the date hereof and at the rates aforesaid and the balance shall be applied in reduction of the Principal Sum.

...

15. The Chargor shall pay all costs charges and expenses incurred hereunder by the Chargee and all other moneys paid by the Chargee ...and all costs on a full indemnity basis to the Chargee or the Receiver of all proceedings for enforcement of the security hereby constituted or for obtaining payment of the moneys hereby secured or any part therefore or arising out of or in connection with the acts authorised by clause 13 hereof (whether or not such charges costs expenses and moneys or part thereof would be allowable upon a taxation by the Court) shall be recoverable from the Chargor as a debt..."

6. The Defendant failed to maintain the terms of repayment as set out in Loan agreement and Legal Charge. As at 5 March 2014, the Defendant was indebted to the Plaintiff in the sum of CI\$103,727.67 including arrears of CI\$28,760.57.
7. On or around 23 April 2014 at 5.10pm, the Defendant was personally served with notices pursuant to Section 64(2) and 72 of the Registered Land Law (2004 Revision) ("Statutory Notices").
8. No payments were received to pay the sums in the Statutory Notices as demanded, or at all. The Plaintiff's right of sale arose on or around 23 July 2014.
9. The Plaintiff obtained two independent valuations and listed the Property for Sale on the CIREBA Multiple Listing System on or around 29 September 2014.
10. The Plaintiff accepted an offer to purchase the Property for CI\$100,000 which closed on or around 16 September 2016. After realtor's fees and other fees and expenses for which the Plaintiff was liable upon closing were paid, the Plaintiff received CI\$94,264.28, which was credited to the Defendant's Loan.
11. As at the date of the closing, the outstanding balance of the Loan was CI\$122,289.89 leaving a shortfall of CI\$28,025.61 after the proceeds of sale were applied. After discharging a large Water Authority Bill for CI\$18020.05 and a Caribbean Utilities Company Ltd bill for CI\$940.58, the Defendant was indebted to the Plaintiff in the sum of CI\$46,045.66 ("the Principal Sum").
12. The Plaintiff claims the Principal Sum together with interest at the contractual rate of 1% above the Bank's Prime Lending rate for Cayman Island Dollars, presently 3.25%, which continues to accrue at the daily rate of CI\$5.36.

13. Alternatively, the Plaintiff claims statutory interest in accordance with the Judicature Law (2013 Revision) and the Judgment Debts (Rates of Interest) Rules, 2010 at such rate as the Court deems fit.
14. The Plaintiff is entitled to, and claims, its contractual fees and all costs of, and incidental to, the enforcement of its rights under the Loan and Legal Charge, on an indemnity basis.
15. As a result of the above, the Plaintiff is entitled to the relief claimed in this proceedings.

AND THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS:

- a) CI\$46,045.66 being the Principal Sum due as at 20 January 2017;
- b) Pre- and post-judgment interest from 17 September 2016 to 20 January 2017 at the rate of 4.25% per annum in the sum of CI\$664.64 and continuing at the rate of CI\$5.36 per diem in accordance with the terms of the Loan and Legal Charge;
- c) Alternatively, pre- and post-judgment interest in accordance with the Judicature Law (2013 Revision) and the Judgment Debts (Rates of Interest) Rules, 2010 at such rate as the Court deems fit.
- d) Costs on an indemnity basis in accordance with the terms of the Credit Agreement;
- e) Such further and other relief as this Court may deem just,

INDORSEMENT

The principal amount claimed in respect of the debt is CI\$46,045.66. The amount of the filing fees to commence the proceeding is CI\$200.00. If, within the time for returning the acknowledgement of service, the defendants pay the plaintiff or its attorneys-at-law the total amount claimed in principal, interest and the costs of issuing the Writ of Summons, further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the plaintiff or to its attorneys-at-law.

INDORSEMENT REGARDING INTEREST

1. The contractual term upon which interest is claimed is as set out in paragraph 3 above;
2. The proscribed rate of interest is 4.25% per annum;
3. The date from which interest is payable is 17 September 2016; and
4. The amount of interest accruing due each day is CI\$5.36.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS**

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of each Defendant or by each Defendant if acting in person.

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, PO Box 495 GT, Grand Cayman.

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgment of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgment of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgment, but he must, within that time, *issue a Summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by instalments or otherwise.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a **FIRM** and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a **PARTNER** by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual **TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN**, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a **LIMITED COMPANY** the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a **MINOR** or a **MENTAL PATIENT**, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
