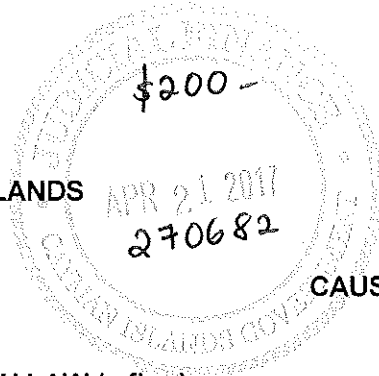

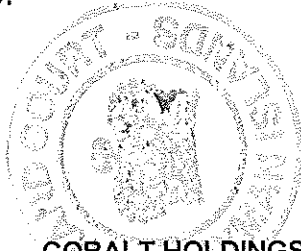

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff of DMS House, 20 Genesis Place, George Town PO Box 1103, Grand Cayman KY1-1102, Cayman Islands in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within 14 days after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O. Box 495, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgment within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgment without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

NOTE - This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.

STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. The Plaintiff ("Cayman Law") is a firm of Cayman Islands attorneys carrying on business from premises at DMS House, 20 Genesis Place, George Town PO Box 1103, Grand Cayman KY1-1102, Cayman Islands.
2. The Defendant ("Cobalt") is a company registered in the state of Delaware at The Corporation Trust Company, 1209 Orange Street, Wilmington, Delaware, 19801, County of New Castle and trading from 101 Waukegan Road, Suite 990, Lake Bluff, IL 60044.
3. Cayman Law provided legal services to Cobalt pursuant to written terms of engagement dated 15 January 2016 ("the Terms"). The Terms were agreed and signed by Edward Mooney, a Director of Cobalt.
4. Pursuant to the Terms, Cayman Law performed legal work on the instructions of Cobalt and duly submitted an invoice for payment, dated 22 May 2016, in the sum of US\$45,871.75. A retainer of US\$3,492.80 was applied leaving a balance owing of US\$42,378.95.
5. In approximately September 2016, Cobalt paid Cayman Law US\$7,000. On the 8th of December 2016 a further payment of \$4,992.80 was paid. Several requests for payment have been issued by Cayman Law upon Cobalt since this date however such requests have been ignored by Cobalt leaving the balance of the debt unpaid.
6. Cobalt has failed to honour the terms of engagement and remains indebted to Cayman Law in the amount of \$30,386.15.
7. Further, the Plaintiff will claim interest pursuant to section 34 of the Judicature Law (as Revised).

AND THE PLAINTIFF claims:

- (1) US\$ 30,386.15
- (2) Interest in accordance with the Judicature Law (as Revised)
- (3) Costs; and
- (4) Such further and/or other relief as this Honourable Court deems appropriate.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS**

1. The accompanying form of Acknowledgment of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person.

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgment of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings must also serve a defence on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A Stay of Execution against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgment of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgment, but he must, within that time, issue a Summons for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by instalments or otherwise.

Please complete overleaf

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Writ of Summons)".
4. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian ad litem.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.

Notes on address for service

Attorney: where the Defendant is represented by an attorney, state the attorney's place of business in the Cayman Islands. A Defendant may not act by a foreign attorney.

Defendant in person: where the Defendant is acting in person, he must give his post office box number and the physical address of his residence or, if he does not reside in the Cayman Islands, he must give an address in Grand Cayman where communications for him should be sent. In the case of a limited company, "residence" means its registered or principal office.
