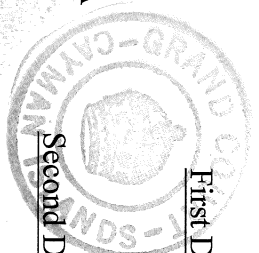

WRIT OF SUMMONS

**TO: DAVID GEORGE NATTY
AND TO: SARAH ELIZABETH BUSHEA
AND TO: CAYMAN FIRST INSURANCE COMPANY LIMITED.**

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within fourteen (14) days after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, 61 Edward Street, George Town, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

NOTE: This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of issued unless renewed by order of the Court.

STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. The Plaintiff is an individual residing in Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands and was born on 29 October 1977.
2. The First Defendant is an individual residing in Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands and was the driver of a Nissan Skyline, registration number 145049 (the “Vehicle”).
3. The Second Defendant is an individual residing in Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands and is the registered owner of the Vehicle.
4. On 16 June 2014 the Plaintiff was lawfully driving her vehicle along Smith Road (a major road) in the direction towards the George Town Hospital. As the Plaintiff approached the intersection of Anthony Drive (a minor road), the First Defendant proceeded from Anthony Drive onto Smith Road. The First Defendant failed to stop at the intersection and collided in the front end of the Plaintiff’s vehicle.
5. As a result of the accident, the Plaintiff suffered personal injuries, loss, damage, inconvenience and expense.
6. The injuries, loss and damage to the Plaintiff were caused by the First and Second Defendants negligence and/or breach of duty including statutory duty under sections 67 and 68 of the Traffic Law (2011 Revision).

PARTICULARS OF BREACH OF DUTY (INCLUDING STATUTORY DUTY)

- a) Failing to exercise due care and attention when using the road and to have due regard to the safety and comfort of other road users and the preservation and protection of public and private property;
- b) Failing to drive in such a manner to have full control of the vehicle at all times;
- c) Failing to keep any or any proper look-out;
- d) Failing to comply with the signs and signals on the road;
- e) Driving the vehicle so as to collide with the Plaintiff’s vehicle;

- f) Colliding with the Plaintiff's vehicle;
 - g) Failing to give way to the Plaintiff;
 - h) Exiting a minor road onto a major road without ensuring the path is clear;
 - i) Failing to stop, slow down, swerve, or in any way so to manage or control the vehicle so as to avoid the collision;
 - j) Failing to see the Plaintiff in sufficient time to avoid colliding with her or at all;
 - k) Failing to exercise reasonable skill and care to be expected of a reasonably skillful and careful driver in the circumstances;
 - l) Failing to maintain the vehicle to an adequate standard.
7. The Plaintiff will rely on the doctrine of Res Ipsa Loquitur.
8. The Plaintiff reserves the right to provide additional particulars of negligence and/or breach of statutory duty at any time up to and including the trial of the action.
9. By reason of the First Defendant's and/or Second Defendant's negligence and/or breach of statutory duty the Plaintiff suffered personal injuries, loss and damage.

PARTICULARS OF INJURIES

10. The Plaintiff has suffered and continues to suffer very serious injuries as a result of the accident. Her injuries include:
- a. Pain in right wrist;
 - b. TFCC tear in right wrist;
 - c. SL ligament tear in right wrist;
 - d. Rotational instability of right wrist;
 - e. Surgery on her right wrist.
11. The extent to which the Plaintiff will be able to recover from her injuries is still unknown. She experiences continuing pain. The injuries have permanently affected the Plaintiff's day-to-day life.
12. The Plaintiff reserves her right to provide further and better particulars of her injuries prior to trial.


PARTICULARS OF SPECIAL DAMAGES

13. The Plaintiff has incurred and will continue to incur expenses, including medical expenses as a result of the accident.
14. Full particulars of the Plaintiff's special damages and losses, which are continuing, will be provided at trial.

AND THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS:

1. Damages;
2. Pre and Post-Judgment interest on damages pursuant to section 34 of the Judicature Law (2013 Revision);
3. Costs;
4. Such further and other relief as this Honourable Court deems just.

INDORSEMENT AS TO INSURER OF MOTOR VEHICLE

The Plaintiff's claim arises out of the use of a motor vehicle on a public road. The insurer of the vehicle driven by the First Defendant named herein is Cayman First Insurance Company Ltd., whose registered office's address is Cayman National Trust Co. Ltd., P.O. Box 30239, 62 Forum Lane, Suite 6201 Camana Bay, Grand Cayman KY1-1201, Cayman Islands.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF SERVICE
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS**

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgement of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person.

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, PO Box 495, George Town, Grand Cayman.

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgement of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is endorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2). The defence must be served within fourteen (14) days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not endorsed on the Writ, the defence need not be served until fourteen (14) days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to question 3 in the Acknowledgment of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for fourteen (14) days after his Acknowledgement, but he must, within that time, *issue a Summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by installments or otherwise.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of fourteen (14) days for acknowledging service, a Writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.

3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words “sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)”.
4. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an Attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description “Partner in the firm of (.....)” after is name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description “trading as (.....)” after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorized to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further steps in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL HEALTH PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
