STATEMENT OF CLAIM

- 1 The Plaintiff is and was at all material times a Cayman Islands company that provides professional catering in the Cayman Islands.
- 2 The Defendants are Canadian citizens who between the dates of 15 December 2016 through 24 December 2016 rented a luxury 7 bedroom Property known as "Kaia Kamina" in the Cayman Islands for themselves and their guests (the "Property").
- 3 The Property as well as the catering services of the Plaintiff were booked by the Defendants through a luxury vacation rental service known as Luxury Cayman Villas (the "Booking Agent").
- 4 Through the Booking Agent the Defendants agreed the menus and pricing of the Plaintiff's catering services which included the use of a personal chef and a food & beverage server.
- 5 The contract was therefore concluded by an exchange of emails between Ann Whiting of Luxury Cayman Villas and the Defendant on 13 and 14 December 2016, pursuant to which the Plaintiff agreed to provide professional catering services to the Defendants at the following prices:

5.1 Brunch \$40 per person (plus 15% service charge);


- 5.2 Dinner \$70 per person (plus 15% service charge);
- 5.3 Chef at \$50 per hour (includes drive time and shopping hours when needed);
- 5.4 Server at \$25 per hour (includes drive time and shopping hours when needed);
- 5.5 Snacks, drinks, alcohol, etc that are bought on top of brunch or dinner to be charged at cost plus 20% surcharge.
- 6 The contract was performed by the Plaintiff at the Property during the Defendants' visit, and the Plaintiff promptly raised two invoices:
- 6.1 Invoice #16658 dated 21 December 2016 in the sum of CI\$22,175 (equal to US\$27,718.75 at the stated exchange rate of CI\$1.00=US\$1.25); and
- 6.2 Invoice #16732 dated 30 December 2016 in the sum of CI\$3,391.42 (equal to US\$4,239.28 at the stated exchange rate of CI\$1.00=US\$1.25).
- 7 The Plaintiff's charges in respect of snacks, drinks and alcohol were duly supported by copies of the receipts of purchases made by the Plaintiff on behalf of the Defendant.
- 8 The total sum payable was therefore CI\$25,566.42 or US\$31,958.03.
- 9 To date, the Defendants have paid US\$12,690.63.
- 10 The sum of US\$19,267.40 remains outstanding and payable to the Plaintiff by the Defendants.
- 11 Despite making repeated demands for the remainder of monies owing from the Defendants (by emails and by a letter before action from the Plaintiff's attorneys on 22 March 2017) the Defendants have failed to pay the balance of US\$19,267.40 and the Plaintiff has suffered loss and damage.

AND THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS:

- (1) US\$19,267.40
- (2) Interest pursuant to section 34 of the Judicature Law (as Revised) to be assessed;
- (3) Costs; and
- (4) Such further and/or other relief as this Honourable Court deems appropriate.

If, within the time for returning the Acknowledgment of Service, the Defendant pays the total amount claimed of US\$19,267.40 any further accruing interest and fixed costs for these proceedings will be stayed.

The funds must be paid to the Plaintiff or its Attorney.

NOTES ON ADDRESS FOR SERVICE

Attorney: where the Defendant is represented by an attorney, state the attorney's place of business in the Cayman Islands. A Defendant may not act by a foreign attorney.

Defendant in person: where the Defendant is acting in person, he must give his post office box number and the physical address of his residence or, if he does not reside in the Cayman Islands, he must give an address in Grand Cayman where communications for him should be sent. In the case of a limited company, "residence" means its registered or principal office.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person.

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgment of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings **must also serve a defence** on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgment of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgment, but he must, within that time, **issue a Summons** for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by instalments or otherwise.

NOTES FOR GUIDANCE

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a **FIRM** and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a **PARTNER** by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual **TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN**, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a **LIMITED COMPANY** the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a **MINOR** or a **MENTAL PATIENT**, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian ad litem.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
