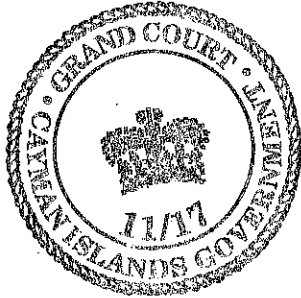

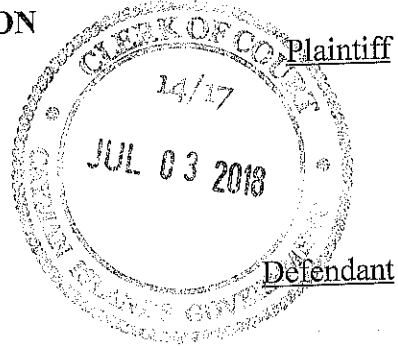

WRIT OF SUMMONS

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within 14 days after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O. Box 495 GT, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgment within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgment without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

Issued this day of July 2018.

NOTE – This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.

Directions for Acknowledgment of Service are given with the accompanying form.

STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. The Plaintiff is an individual who resides at 16 Coco Retreat, John Greer Blvd, George Town, Grand Cayman.
2. The Defendant was the owner and driver of vehicle registration number 158128 (“the Vehicle”) and resides at 51 Tennyson Street, Grand Cayman.
3. On the 2nd June 2017, at approximately 06.15 pm the Plaintiff was a lawful passenger in the Vehicle which was being driven by the Defendant in a westerly direction on Eastern Avenue. At reaching the Saxon Building the Defendant, in an attempt to overtake stationary traffic, moved to the incorrect (right hand) side of the road. He remained on the incorrect side of the road and continued to drive west, at speed. When approaching the junction of Harper’s Close vehicle registration number 136149 emerged and turned right onto the east bound lane of Eastern Avenue. The Vehicle then collided with vehicle 136149 causing the Plaintiff personal injury, loss, damage, inconvenience and expense.
4. The said accident was caused by the Defendant’s negligence and breach of duty, including statutory duty pursuant to section 67 and 68 of the Traffic Law (2011 Revision).

PARTICULARS OF NEGLIGENCE AND BREACH OF DUTY

- a. Driving in the incorrect (right hand) side of the road;
- b. Attempting to overtake a stationary line of traffic by travelling on the incorrect side of the road;
- c. Failed to give way to a vehicle traveling on the correct side of the road;
- d. Failure to exercise due care and attention when using the road;
- e. Failure to have due regard to the safety and comfort of other road users;

- f. Failure to drive in such a manner as to have full control of the vehicle at all times;
 - g. Driving at a speed which was too fast in all the circumstances;
 - h. Driving in a manner which was not safe in all the circumstances;
 - i. Driving the vehicle so as to collide with another vehicle;
 - j. Failing to keep any or any proper look out;
 - k. Failed to see the other Vehicle in sufficient time to avoid colliding with it;
 - l. Failing to stop, swerve, slow down or otherwise avoid the accident;
 - m. Failing to manage the vehicle so as to be able to stop within the limit of vision;
 - n. Failed to exercise reasonable skill and care as should be expected of a reasonably skillful and careful driver;
 - o. Was otherwise in breach of sections 67 and 68 of the Traffic Law (2011 Revision).
5. Further, the Plaintiff shall rely on the doctrine of Res Ipsa Locquitur.
 6. By reason of the aforementioned the Plaintiff suffered personal injuries, loss, damage, inconvenience and expense.

PARTICULARS OF INJURIES

7. The Plaintiff was occasioned to suffer injuries to her neck, shoulder and back, which radiated down into her right arm, also with some numbness. The jarring of the collision also caused her to injure her hip.
8. She has also suffered from post-concussion syndrome, with floaters in her eyes, headaches, tinnitus, depression and difficulty concentrating.
9. Her injury is ongoing and prognosis is uncertain.

PARTICULARS OF SPECIAL DAMAGE

10. The Plaintiff has incurred and will continue to incur medical, travel and other expenses and losses as a result of the accident. Full particulars of the Plaintiff's special damages and losses, which are continuing, will be provided at trial.

AND THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS:

- 1) Damages;
- 2) Pre-judgment interest pursuant to s. 34 of the Judicature Law (2017 Revision);
- 3) Post-judgment interest pursuant to s. 34 of the Judicature Law (2017 Revision);
- 4) Costs;
- 5) Such further and other relief as this Honourable Court shall deem just.

NOTES ON ADDRESS FOR SERVICE

Attorney: where the Defendant is represented by an Attorney, state the Attorney's place of business in the Cayman Islands. A Defendant may not act by a foreign Attorney.

Defendant in person: where the Defendant is acting in person, he must give his post office box number and physical address of his residence or, if he does not reside in the Cayman Islands, he must give an address in Grand Cayman where communications for him should be sent. In the case of a limited company, "residence" means its registered or principal office.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE OF WRIT OF SUMMONS

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person.

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgment of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a Defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.

If the Defendant fails to serve his Defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. *A Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgment of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgment, but he must, within that time, *issue a Summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by installments or otherwise.

NOTES FOR GUIDANCE

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Writ of Summons)".
4. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, he must complete the form with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an attorney or by someone authorized to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, an Attorney acting for a guardian ad litem must complete the form.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
