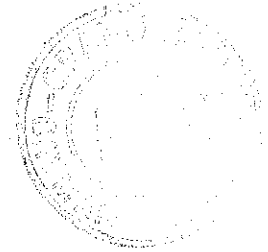
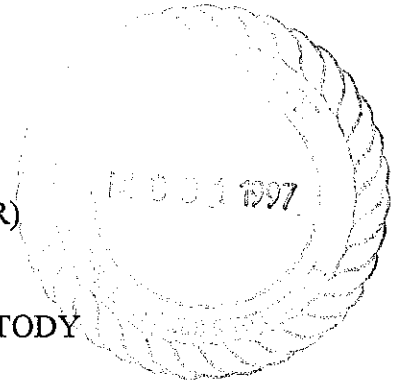
**ORIGINATING SUMMONS**

2. That the care and control of the said minor be committed to the Plaintiff and the Defendant be strictly enjoined from removing the said minor out of the control of the Plaintiff until further order of this Honourable Court.
3. That the cost of this application be provided for.
4. That the Plaintiff may be granted such further and/or other relief as this Honourable Court deems appropriate.
5. The date of birth for the said minor named herein, is the 13th September, 1989.
6. The aforesaid minor child currently resides with the Plaintiff in the district of Bodden Town, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands.
7. The Plaintiff is the lawful mother, and the Defendant is the lawful father of the aforesaid minor child.

**If the Defendant does not acknowledge service, such judgment may be given or order made against or in relation to him as this Honourable Court may think just and expedient.**

**Notes for Guidance**

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, an Originating Summons served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)".
4. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an Attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his

name.

5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
