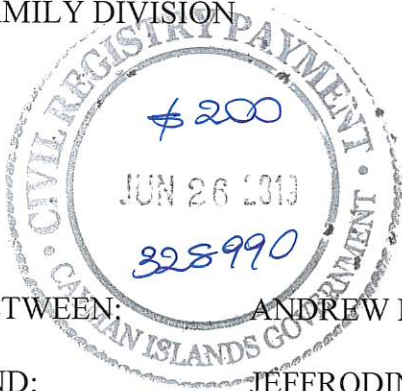

PETITION FOR DISSOLUTION OF MARRIAGE

THE PETITION of ANDREW R. WILLIAMS states:-



1. That on the 11th day of June, 2014 at the Oneness Apostolic Church, George Town, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands, the above Petitioner was lawfully married to the above Respondent and at the time of the said marriage the marital status of the parties were as follows:
 - The Petitioner was never married; and
 - The Respondent was divorced
2. That the Court has jurisdiction of the said marriage by reason that the Petitioner has been ordinarily resident in the Cayman Islands for a period in excess of two years prior to the presentation of this Petition. The Petitioner is Caymanian by birth. The Respondent is a Jamaican national.
3. That there have been no previous proceedings brought by the parties hereto in any Court either inside or outside the Cayman Islands with respect to the said marriage.
4. That after the celebration of the marriage the parties lived together at 13 Tidyman Lane, North Side, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands.

5. That there is no impediment to the Honourable Court granting a decree of dissolution of the marriage.
6. The marriage has been broken down on grounds of desertion pursuant to section 10(1)(c) of the Matrimonial Causes Law 2005 Revision in that the respondent has deserted the petitioner for a continuous period of at least two years immediately preceding the presentation of this petition. The marriage has been irretrievably broken down with no chance of reconciliation.

PARTICULARS OF DESERTION

7. The particulars of desertion has been adopted from the Verifying Affidavit as follows:
 - a. "The Respondent has deserted me for a continuous period of at least two years immediately preceding the presentation of the Petition. The Respondent left the former matrimonial home around late December, 2016 more than 2 1/2 years ago and has not returned to the former matrimonial home since that date.
 - b. The marriage was a short one. Throughout the marriage, the Respondent has always wrongfully accused me of having extra-marital affairs. I did not like the constant harassment and this would cause us to have many quarrels and sometimes fights. The Respondent was always complaining that the marriage was a mistake and that she wanted a divorce. The Respondent told me that she was moving out of the matrimonial home and although I begged her to stay, she left me in tears.
 - c. The Respondent did not seem to care that she was hurting my feelings. She was always going out and partying without me and I got the feeling that she was having an

affair with someone else and that may be the reason she was wrongfully accusing me of having affairs. I believe this was just her way of getting out of the former matrimonial home and leaving me.

d. I do not know where the Petitioner lives or works. She has never come back to the former matrimonial home or even tried to reconcile the marriage. I have tried to make up with her but she told me I can go ahead and divorce her because she does not want anything to do with me.

e. I am convinced that the marriage is broken down irretrievably with no chance of reconciliation.”

8. There are no matrimonial property and liabilities to be divided between the parties.


9. There are no children of the marriage as defined by law.

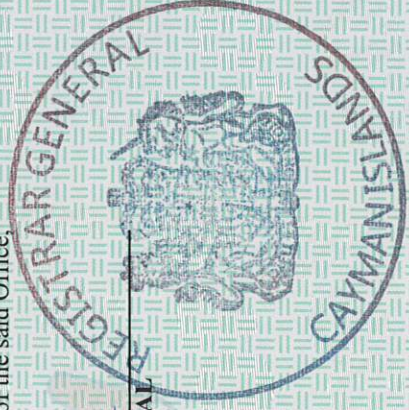
