ORIGINATING SUMMONS

LET THE DEFENDANTS, of French Drive, West Bay, Grand Cayman and 105 Velma Banks Drive, West Bay, Grand Cayman, respectively, attend before a Judge in Chambers, at the Law Courts, George Town, Grand Cayman on the day of 2020, at o'clock in the noon on the hearing of an application by the Plaintiff that:

1. An Inhibition Order be made against the Defendants, and/or their agents preventing them or either of from selling or disposing of property being Registration Section West Bay North West Block 4B Parcel 538.
2. An Order be made compelling the Defendants to transfer Registration Section West Bay North West Block 4b Parcel 538 into the name of the Second-Named Defendant.
3. An Order be made compelling the Second-Named Defendant that on transfer of Registration Section West Bay North West Block 4B Parcel 538 that he forthwith transfers the said property to the Plaintiff for natural love and affection.
4. One or either or both of the Defendants do bear the costs of these proceedings.

AND LET THE DEFENDANT within 14 days after service of this Summons on her counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service to the Courts Office.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE  
OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS**

The accompanying form of Acknowledgment of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

**Notes for Guidance**

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the Writ of Summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them in so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the Acknowledgment of Service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a Writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Writ of Summons)".
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an Attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
8. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
9. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
