

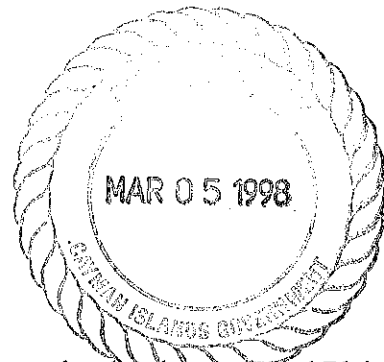
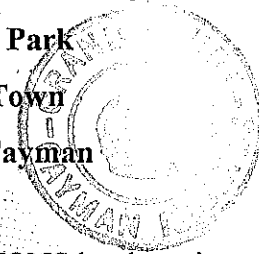

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiffs in respect of the claims set out on the next page.

We command you that within 14 days after service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O. Box 495, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiffs may proceed with the action and judgement may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of issue inless renewed by order of the Court).


STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. The Plaintiff is a law firm having as its place of business at Fort Street, George Town, Grand Cayman.
2. The Defendant is a taxi driver and hotel/condominium worker whose residence is located in Windsor Park, George Town, Grand Cayman. The Defendant's mailing address is P.O. Box 1664, George Town, Grand Cayman.
3. The Plaintiff provided legal services to the Defendant at the Defendant's request, such services being invoiced under invoice number 0016/EN/1996 dated the 13th February, 1996 in the amount of CI\$3,661.00 and invoice number 073/EN/1997 dated the 23rd July, 1997 in the amount of CI\$5,432.00. Details of the services provided were particularized in the said feenotes.
4. The Defendant to date has only paid CI\$1,000.00 on the said outstanding account.
5. Despite numerous reminders and requests for payment in full, the Defendant has not paid the outstanding sum of CI\$8,093.00.
6. The Defendant therefore still owes the Plaintiff the sum of CI\$8,093.00.

AND THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS:-

1. The Sum of CI\$8,093.00
2. Interest pursuant to the Judicature Law.
3. Cost of this action.
4. Such further and other relief as this Honourable Court deems fit and proper.

Notes on address for service

Attorney: Where the Defendant is represent by an attorney, state the attorney's place of business in the Cayman Islands. A Defendant may not act by a foreign attorney.

Defendant in person: Where the Defendant is acting in person, he must give his post office box number and the Physical address of his residence or, if he does not reside in the Cayman Islands, he must give an address in Grand Cayman where communications for him should be sent. In the case of a limited company, "residence" means its registered or principal office.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF SERVICE
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS

1. The accompanying form of Acknowledgement of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person.

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgement of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings must also serve a defence on the Attorney for the Plaintiffs (or on the Plaintiffs if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgement is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiffs may enter judgement against him without further notice.

3. A Stay of Execution against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgement is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgement of Service, but he must, within that time, issue a Summons for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by installments or otherwise.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Writ of Summons)".
4. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (_____)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (_____)" after his name.

6. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian ad litem.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
