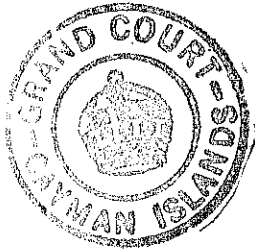

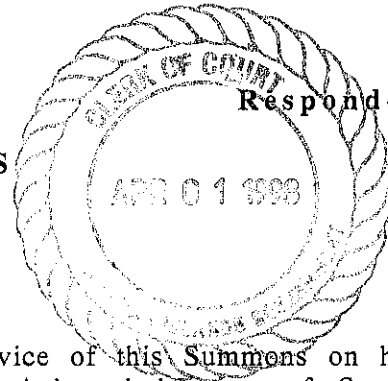

By this Summons, which is issued on the application of Sheldon Everal Anderson of Grand Cayman, the Plaintiff claim against the Respondent seeks the determination of the Court on the following question, namely, that Sheldon Everal Anderson, Jr. and Andre Neco Anderson be made Wards of the Court until such time as they are able to return to their mother Juliet Peart who is presently residing in the United States.

If the Respondent does not acknowledge service, such judgment may be given or order made against or in relation to him as the Court may think just and expedient.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF SERVICE
OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS**

The accompanying form of *Acknowledgement of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Respondent or by the Respondent if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495, G.T. Grand Cayman.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Respondent (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a Writ served on the Respondent personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Respondent is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Originating Summons*)".
4. Where the Respondent is a FIRM and an Attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Respondent is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Respondent is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Respondent is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Respondent acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
