**TO:    CHRISTOPHER LANGLOIS**, of an address to be notified.

**THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS** has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff, of 1340 South Sound Road, P.O. Box 11155, Grand Cayman KY1-1008, Cayman Islands in respect of claims set out on the next page.

Within 14 days after service of this Writ on you counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Courts Office, P.O. Box 495, George Town, Grand Cayman, KY1-1106, Cayman Islands the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgment within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgment without stating therein any intention to contest the proceedings, the

Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

NOTE this Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of original issuance unless renewed by order of the Court.

**STATEMENT OF CLAIM**

1. The Plaintiff is and was at all material times the restrained driver of a 2012 Land Rover LR3, registration number 179 209.
2. The Defendant was at all material times the driver of a vehicle, registration number 149 283, which had been rented by the Defendant from Andy's Rent a Car of 325 Roberts Drive, George Town, Grand Cayman ("**Vehicle**").
3. At all material times the Vehicle was insured with Saxon Motor and General Insurance Company Ltd ("**Saxon**") whose address is Saturn Close, George Town, Grand Cayman, KY1-1205, Cayman Islands, who had issued a policy of insurance relating to the Vehicle in accordance with the Vehicle Insurance (Third Party Risks) Law (2012 Revision).
4. The Plaintiff's claim arises out of use of the Vehicle on a public road. On 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2019 the Plaintiff was travelling along South Sound Road, towards Hurley's roundabout, Red Bay. The Plaintiff was stationary in traffic when the Vehicle, driven by the Defendant, collided with the rear of the Plaintiff's vehicle.

**PARTICULARS OF NEGLIGENCE**

5. The said accident was caused by the negligence of the Defendant in that he:
  - a. Failed to keep any or any proper look out;
  - b. Failed to drive with due care and attention;
  - c. Failed to have due regard to the safety of other road users;
  - d. Failed to see the Plaintiff's vehicle in time or at all;
  - e. Failed to keep an adequate distance between the Vehicle and the Plaintiff's vehicle;
  - f. Failed to steer or control the Vehicle or to apply the brakes adequately whether in time or at all;
  - g. Failed to keep proper control of the Vehicle.
6. By reason of the aforesaid negligence of the Defendant, the Plaintiff has sustained personal injury, loss and damage.

**PARTICULARS OF GENERAL DAMAGES**

7. The Plaintiff's date of birth is 5 December 1973 and at the date of the accident he was 45 years old.
8. The Plaintiff has suffered injuries caused or exacerbated by the accident which include the following:

- a. Neck pain and restriction of movement of the neck;
  - b. An exacerbation of a previous traumatic brain injury;
  - c. Paraesthesia in the right upper limb;
  - d. Recurrence of visual difficulties including photophobia and convergence insufficiency;
  - e. Headaches, difficulties with his balance, ataxia, and an exacerbation of pre-existing Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder symptoms;
  - f. Lack of concentration, decreased focus and memory, and increased anxiety;
  - g. Fatigue and disordered sleeping.
9. The Plaintiff received treatment and care from a neurologist and a neurosurgeon at Health City Cayman Islands as well as a respiratory therapist and pulmonologist.
  10. The Plaintiff underwent, and continues to undergo, hyperbaric oxygen therapy (initially at Will of Wellness, Cayman Islands and currently at home following the purchase of a second hand hyperbaric chamber); neurac treatments at Will of Wellness, Cayman Islands; and vestibular and craniosacral therapy at Synergy Chiropractic and Physiotherapy, Cayman Islands.
  11. The Plaintiff has suffered loss of amenities and his quality of life has been reduced with substantial limitation of his recreational, social and lifestyle activities. Further particulars of the Plaintiff's injuries will be provided prior to trial.
  12. Full particulars of general damages will be forwarded in due course by way of a Schedule of Loss.


#### **PARTICULARS OF SPECIAL DAMAGE**

13. Full particulars of the Plaintiff's special damages will be forwarded in due course by way of a Schedule of Loss including but not limited to claims for costs of medical treatment and travel and expenses for medical assessments and treatment and compensation for the damage caused to the Plaintiff's vehicle.
14. Further, the Plaintiff claims interest upon such damages as may be awarded to him pursuant to section 34 of the Judicature Act (2021 Revision) at the rate prescribed in the Judgment Debts (Rates of Interest) Rules (2021 Revision), being 2 3/8%, from 2 May 2019 and for such period as the Honourable Court may deem fit.

**AND THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS:**

- a) General Damages;
- b) Special Damages;
- c) Pre-judgment and Post-judgment interest as in accordance with section 34 of the Judicature Law (2017 Revision) as aforesaid;
- d) Further and/or other relief as the Honourable Court shall deem fit; and
- e) Costs

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF SERVICE  
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS**

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgement of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person.

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, PO Box 495, George Town, Grand Cayman.

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgement of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is endorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words “Statement of Claim” appear on the top of page 2). The defence must be served within fourteen (14) days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not endorsed on the Writ, the defence need not be served until fourteen (14) days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant’s goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to question 3 in the Acknowledgment of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for fourteen (14) days after his Acknowledgement, but he must, within that time, *issue a Summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by instalments or otherwise.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of fourteen (14) days for acknowledging service, a Writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words “sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)”.
4. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an Attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description “Partner in the firm of (.....)” after is name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description “trading as (.....)” after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorized to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further steps in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL HEALTH PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
