



**PARTICULARS OF CLAIM**

I was employed by Cayman Luxury Charters, to do deck hand maintenance work at a fixed rate of \$8.00 per hour at 40 hours per week. I am filing a claim to collect monies owed to me by my former employer in terms of unpaid wages, unpaid bank holidays, vacation days, reimbursement for health insurance and wrongful termination of work permit. I am also filing for punitive damage in the amounts of C\$5000.00 which will be added to the total sum. I was working for Cayman Luxury Charters for eight Months without pay. While working there I was offered accommodations to which there was no signed rental agreement between both parties so no deductions will be made concerning living arrangements. It is also worth mentioning that I was fired unlawfully violating the **Labour Act Section 10 (1)**, and my work permit was terminated without my knowledge with intentions of putting me in bad terms with immigration and Cayman Border Control (CBC) since it caused me to be residing in the islands unlawfully for a short time. Since the last meeting with Mr. O'Brien no offer has been presented to settle this matter so now after 30 days has passed, I have decided to settle this matter through summary court making a full claim.

1. Outstanding Wage Calculation.
2. Emails correspondence between Ms. Sacha Rankine of the Department of Labour & Pension and Patrick O'Brien of Cayman Luxury Charters.
3. Video Recording of the conference call (Will be made available once in possession from FOI request.
4. Letter written to Customs & Border Control (CBC) explaining reasons for overstaying due to suspected sabotage by former employers.

AND the Plaintiff claims:

1. The sum of \$17,668.00.
