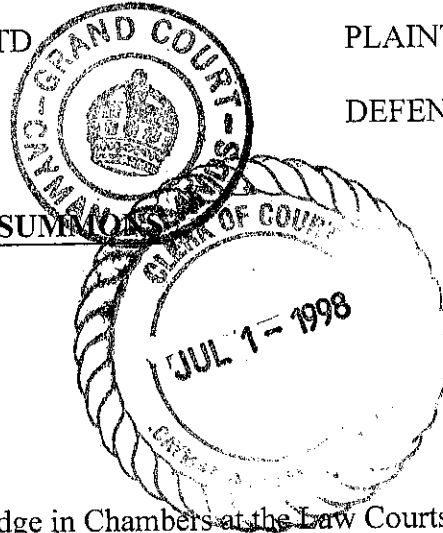

LET THE DEFENDANT attend before the Judge in Chambers at the Law Courts, George Town, Grand Cayman on the *3rd* day of *Aug* 1998 at *9:30* o'clock in the noon on the hearing of an application by the Plaintiff of P.O. Box 396, West Bay, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands, British West Indies for an Order:

1. That the Cedar Batch Plant situate upon the premises known as George Town East, Block 19E, Parcel 117 is not a fixture.
2. Alternatively, if, contrary to the foregoing the Cedar Batch Plant is a fixture, that the Plaintiff is entitled to remove the same from the premises.
3. That such other items situate upon the said premises as the Defendant may claim to be fixtures, are not fixtures.
4. Alternatively if, contrary to the foregoing, such other items situate upon the said premises as the Defendant may claim to be fixtures are in law fixtures, that the Plaintiff is entitled to remove the same from the premises.

5. That the Defendant do pay to the Plaintiff the costs of and occasioned by this Originating Summons.

If the Defendant does not acknowledge service such judgment may be given or Order made against or in relation to her as the Court may think just and expedient.

IMPORTANT

Directions for Acknowledgment of Service are given with the accompanying form.

This Originating Summons was issued by W.S. Walker & Company, P.O. Box 265, Caledonian House, Mary Street, George Town, Grand Cayman, Attorneys-at-Law for the Plaintiff herein whose address for service is that of its said Attorneys-at-Law.

Notes on address for Service

Attorney: where the Defendant is represented by an attorney, state the attorney's place of business in the Cayman Islands. A Defendant may not act by a foreign attorney.

Defendant in person: where the Defendant is acting in person, he must give his post box number and the physical address of his residence or, if he does not reside in the Cayman Islands, he must give an address in Grand Cayman where communications for him should be sent. In the case of a limited company, "residence" means its registered principal office.

Indorsement by Plaintiff's Attorney (or by Plaintiff if suing in person) of his name, address and reference, if any, in the box below.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS

The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the Originating Summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the Acknowledgment of Service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a Writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)".
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
8. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian ad litem.
9. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
