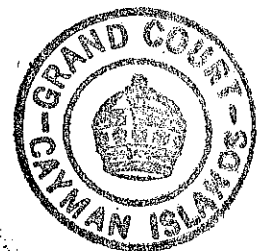


THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of a claim set out the next page.

Within fourteen (14) days after service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O.Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgement may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

SPECIAL INDORSEMENT

1. The plaintiff is a local Company licenced to sell cement
2. The defendant is a builder and operates a business by the name "Structures & Services" and is presently working on a building off Walkers Road in front of the Catholic School.
3. Between the 23rd April and the 21st May, 1998 the defendant obtained cement from the plaintiff and gave five (5) cheques drawn on British American Bank, valued in the sum of \$6,563.00 in payment thereof.
4. The cheques were deposited to the plaintiff's account at CIBC but when they were sent to the British American Bank for clearance, they were dishonoured.
5. The plaintiff made several telephone calls to the defendant who promised to pay cash to the plaintiff and recover his cheques but he has failed to do so.

Wherefore the plaintiff prays that the defendant be ordered to pay:

1. The amount due on the cheques =\$6,563.00
2. Bank charge on 5 cheques at of \$20.00 each =\$ 100.00
3. Interest at the rate of 7 7/8 % per annum from the 21st May until payment
4. Costs to be taxed or agreed.
