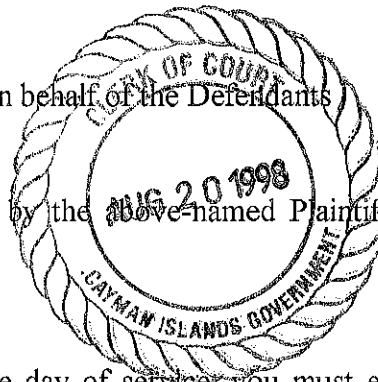

**THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS** has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiffs in respect of the claim set out on the next page.



Within 14 days after service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O. Box 495GT, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgment within the time state, or if you return the Acknowledgment without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

ISSUED this 20th day of August 1998.

**NOTE** - This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.

**IMPORTANT**

Directions for Acknowledgment of Service are given with the accompanying form.

2. Damages under the Estates Proceedings Law (1995 Revision) on behalf of the estate of the Deceased for the loss caused to him by the negligence of the servants or agents of the First, Second, Third and/or Fourth Defendants.
3. Interest on the said damages pursuant to section 34 of the Judicature Law (1995 Revision) and the Judgment Debts (Rates of Interest) Rules 1998.



**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE  
OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS**

The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion, it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

*Notes for Guidance*

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Originating Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
