PARTICULARS OF CLAIM

1. On the 18th of May 2018, the Plaintiff and Defendants entered into an oral agreement for the Defendants to take possession of the Plaintiff's four (4), Neuma category five (5) strength doors along with a four paneled sliding patio door 12 foot by 8 foot (\$9,500USD) for safe keeping.
2. The Plaintiff and Defendants kept in touch via phone and email, but COVID hit, and the Plaintiff was unable to gain access to the island and regain possession of his doors. The Defendants slowly became unresponsive.
3. On the 9th of November 2022, the Plaintiff physically gained access to the island (visited). The Plaintiff knocked on the Defendant's doors several times, emailed and called during this visit to Cayman, to retrieve the doors.
4. On the 9th of February 2023, the Defendants informed the Plaintiff that they had disposed of all the Plaintiff's \$9,500USD worth of building materials. The Defendants provided no notice of disposal, no date, and no photos.
