Box 495 George Town, Ky1- 1106 Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service form stating whether you intend to contest the action, or if you intend to defend the action, in whole or in part, you must set **out full particulars of your defence** in the space provided in the Acknowledgement of service form.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or return the Acknowledgement of Service form containing full particulars of your defence, the Plaintiff may apply for a **default judgement** without any further notice to you.

PARTICULARS OF CLAIM

(Here set out in numbered paragraphs the grounds upon which the Plaintiff claim that the Defendant is indebted to her).

1. The Plaintiff claim that she is a student at St. Matthew's University School of Medical here in the Cayman Islands and met the Defendant while waiting for a bus that did not come.
2. The Plaintiff claim that the Defendant stopped and offered her a ride and with fear of being late for class, she took the ride and while talking to each other, she found out that the defendant was friends with her former roommate's boyfriend, and they too became friends.
3. The Plaintiff claim that she asked the Defendant if he know anyone renting a car so she could share with her medical school mates to go to and from school, groceries while here and he said instead of renting a car as a student, he have an extra car sitting in his driveway that only needs inspection approval and if they pay this, they could use the car while they were here, and she asked how much is the inspection and he said \$400.00 ci and showed her a picture of the car.
4. The Plaintiff claim she gave the Defendant \$185.00 on June 2, 2023, \$125.00 July 17, 2023 and after paying \$310 ci, the defendant now said the inspection will cost \$365.00ci more and the plaintiff told the defendant that was not the agreement and that she did not have anymore and he said don't worry he will cover it, but the next week the defendant came back and asked to borrow \$100.00 because he put all his funds on the car and will give it back the next day when his paycheck clears and she lend him the \$100.00.
5. The Plaintiff claim days went by and the Defendant will always have an excuse as to why the car is not ready as such, and he said the car is missing a few parts or he is waiting on the license plate, and he would bring the car on a certain day but he never did and in an argument to see the progress of the car, she found out that the defendant rented the car to someone else and she asked for the return of her money totaling \$410.00 and he continue promising he would return her money on certain days but never did.
- 6 The Plaintiff claim she had to leave the Islands and asked him to give it to a friend/taxi lady Ms. Maizie Murray and he said yes and they were corresponding and he promise to give it to her but never did and after a while she told him I will take him to court and he still promise but never return her money.
7. The Plaintiff claim she reported him to Marl road thinking this would help and he promise again and again to return her money but he never returned her money.
8. The Plaintiff claim that this is her last semester ending December 2023 and need her money before she leaves but fearing he will never return her money and this is the reason she needs help from the Court to have him return her money before she leaves.

9. The Plaintiff claim she and her class mates ended up paying taxi and bus while he rented the car they funded and also found out that the inspection only cost \$ 30.00 ci.

AND the Plaintiff claims:

1. The sum of \$410.00 ci
2. Interest on the sum calculated at the prescribes rate from to date. *\$120.00 CI*
3. The Court filing fee \$25.00
4. \$100.00 for the preparation of this Plaint.

If the Defendant fail to serve his defense within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter a judgment against him without further notice.
