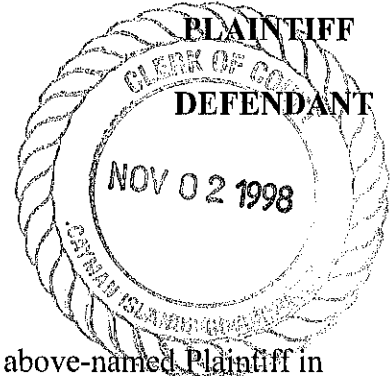

WRIT OF SUMMONS



TO: Allan Connolly, Gun Bay, East End, Grand Cayman

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within 14 *days* after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or return the Acknowledgment within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgment without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

Issued this 2nd day of November 1998.

NOTE - This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (*or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months*) beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.

Directions for Acknowledgment of Service are given with the accompanying form.

STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. The Plaintiff is a police constable of George Town Grand Cayman.
2. The Defendant is a former police constable of Gun Bay, East End, Grand Cayman and the former owner of a 1993 Toyota Pick -up.
3. On or about 13th June 1997. the Defendant entered into an agreement with the Plaintiff to sell a damaged 1993 Toyota Pick-up to the Plaintiff for the sum of CI\$ 3500.
4. On 13th June 1997 the Plaintiff took possession of the said Pick-up and the Defendant promised to provide all necessary documents to effect the transfer of title of the vehicle the next day. This the Defendant failed to do and repeatedly failed to do on numerous occasions.
5. On or about 15th June 1997 the Plaintiff effected various repairs to the said vehicle for a total cost of CI\$ 2525.
6. On or about August 1997 the Royal Bank of Canada repossessed the vehicle under a lien and the Defendant promised to repay the Plaintiff the sum of CI\$ 6025. Despite further assurances the Defendant has failed to make payment.

AND THE PLAINTIFF claims:

1. The sum of CI\$ 6025 pursuant to Sections 5-7 inclusive of the Contracts Law.
2. Interest pursuant to the Judicature Law at the prescribed rate of 7 7/8 % p.a. from 15th June 1997 for a total amount of CI\$ 653.90 at 1st November 1998 and a daily rate of interest of CI\$1.30
3. Fixed costs of CI\$ 250.00.
4. Filing and Service Fees of CI\$175.00.

If, within the time for returning the Acknowledgment of Service, the Defendant says the total amount claimed of CI\$ 7103.90 (including interest and costs) further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the Plaintiff or his Attorney.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person.

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgment of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgment of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgment, but he must, within that time, *issue a Summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by installments or otherwise.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words “sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)”.
4. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description “Partner in the firm of (.....)” after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description “trading as (.....)” after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Court Office.
