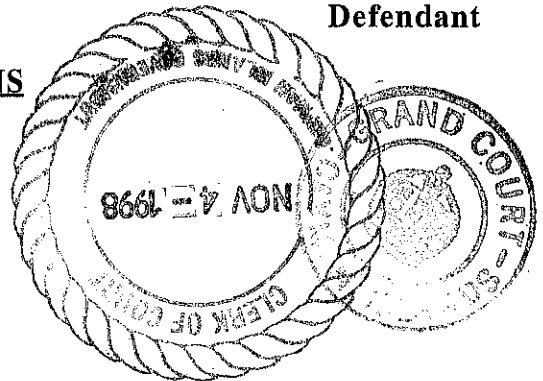

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within (14 days) after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O. Box 495, G.T. Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

Note - This Writ may not be served later than 4 calender months (*or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6, months*) beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.

STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. The Plaintiff rented accommodation from the Defendant from February of 1998 to the 19th of September, 1998.
2. On a date between the days of the 19th to the 21st of August the Plaintiff returned to his premises and found that a wall had been knocked down to gain access to his room. This wall was knocked down by the Defendant and gave the Defendant access to the Plaintiffs cupboard in his room.
3. The following items were removed from a bag inside the cupboard directly positioned where the Defendant broke through into the cupboard:-
 1. CI\$1,700.00 cash which was in an envelope which had been placed underneath a bag which was located in the cupboard directly where the Defendant broke through.
 2. A Canon automatic camera valued at some CI\$105.00.
4. The following items have either been damaged or have been ruined by the actions of the Defendant in breaking through.
 1. One pump for the fish tank which was damaged beyond repair CI\$55.00
 2. One pair of shoes, which were in the closet, of which only one shoe can now be discovered CI\$60.00.
 3. Seven pairs of trousers, cleaning costs CI\$28.00.
 4. Two suits, cleaning cost CI\$23.10.
 5. Seventeen shirts, cleaning costs CI\$40.80.
5. Additionally, the fish tank into which a large amount of debris fell when the Plaintiff broke through caused the death of three fish to a replacement cost of CI\$24.00 as well as the earlier mentioned damage to the pump.
6. Additionally two chairs required cleaning following being covered with debris, a total of CI\$60.00 incurred in that cleaning process.
7. The Plaintiff has required the landlord to reimburse him not only his damage and cleaning costs but also the cash which was stolen.
8. The Plaintiff, having spoke to his attorney was advised to seek assistance from the Royal Cayman Islands Police in relation to the theft of the money. He was advised that this was purely a civil matter and that he was to take his own action in respect of this problem.
9. Despite repeated request and efforts, therefore, on the part of the Plaintiff the cash and other costs still remain outstanding.

The Plaintiff, therefore, claims:

1. CI\$1,700.00 together with associated cleaning and replacement costs totalling CI\$395.90;
2. Interest in accordance with the Judicature Law from the date of issuance of this Plaint; and
3. Costs.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF SERVICE
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS**

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgement of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person.

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495, G.T. Grand Cayman.
2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgement of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is not endorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the defence must be served within fourteen (14) days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is endorsed on the Writ, the defence need not be served until fourteen (14) days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the plaintiff, may enter judgment against him within further notice.
3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to question 3 in the Acknowledgement of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for fourteen days after his Acknowledgment, but he must, within that time, *issue a summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by instalments or otherwise.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a Writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an Attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
