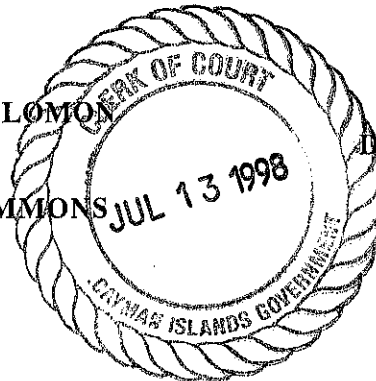
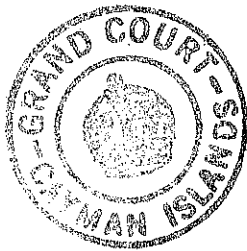

ORIGINATING SUMMONS

LET THE DEFENDANT, within [14 days] after the service of this Summons on him, counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service to the Courts Office, P.O. Box 495, G.T. Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands.

By this Summons, which is issued on the application of Leolin Adina Solomon Vigilant and Vernon Vigilant, the Plaintiffs claim against the Defendant the following relief:-

1. That there be an injunction restraining the Defendant, his servants or agents from coming onto or trespassing in anyway onto Bodden Town 44B, 217.
2. That there be an injunction keeping the Defendant, his servants or agents away from Hazel Adith Solomon McDonald.
3. That there be a rectification of the Land Register in relation to Bodden Town, Block 44B, Parcel 217, Bodden Town, Block 44B, Parcel 360, Duck Pond, Block 42A, Parcel 4, Duck Pond, Block 42A, Parcel 8 to remove the name Alfred Solomon and to return the name of Hazel Adith Solomon McDonald.

If the Defendant does not acknowledge service, such judgment may be given or order made against or in relation to him as the Court may think just and

expedient.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF SERVICE
OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS**

The accompanying form of *Acknowledgement of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495, G.T. Grand Cayman.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a Writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Originating Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an Attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
