ORDER

UPON the petition of Michael Pearson and Richard Murphy dated 21 June 2024 as joint voluntary liquidators of HH&L Acquisition Co for orders that the company's voluntary liquidation be continued under the supervision of the Court pursuant to section 124(1) of the Companies Act (2023 Revision) and that the Petitioners be appointed joint official liquidators of the Company

AND UPON reading the first affidavit of Michael Pearson sworn on 21 June 2024, the first affidavit of Richard Murphy sworn on 21 June 2024, the second affidavit of Richard Murphy sworn on 16 July 2024 and their respective exhibits

AND UPON reading the Petitioners' skeleton argument filed on 16 July 2024

AND UPON the Court being satisfied on the evidence filed that (i) the Petitioners have given notice of the petition to the Company's known creditors and (ii) none of those known creditors has objected to the appointment of the Petitioners as joint official liquidators

AND UPON the Court considering the petition suitable to be disposed of on the papers without the need for an oral hearing

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

1. The liquidation of the Company shall continue under the supervision of the Court.

2. The following persons are hereby appointed as joint official liquidators of the Company:

3. The joint official liquidators may act jointly and severally.
4. The joint official liquidators are not required to give security for their appointment.
5. The joint official liquidators may exercise within and outside the Cayman Islands any of the powers conferred on them by section 110(2) and Part II of the Third Schedule to the Companies Act without the need for further sanction by the Court.
6. The joint official liquidators may receive reasonable remuneration for their services by reference to time properly given by them and their staff in attending to matters arising in the liquidation of the Company. The hourly rates and the amount of such remuneration shall be determined in accordance with the Companies Act, the Companies Winding Up Rules 2023 and the Insolvency Practitioners Regulations 2023.
7. The joint official liquidators may engage attorneys and other professionally qualified persons in the Cayman Islands to assist them in the performance of their functions.
8. The joint official liquidators shall report to the Court on the conduct of the liquidation within six months of the date of their appointment and thereafter at such intervals as the joint official liquidators may think fit, but which shall not be less frequent than annually.
9. The costs of this Petition shall be paid forthwith from the assets of the Company as an expense of the liquidation.
