This PLAINT is filed by the Plaintiff LOVELL MARRIOTT as a litigant in person whose address is 106 Randyke Garden Apartment #25, George Town Cayman Islands.

PARTICULARS OF CLAIM

Here set out in numbered paragraphs the grounds upon which the Plaintiff claims that the Defendant is indebted to him or is liable to pay default judgment to her. Chief

Justice must be held accountable for the unfair trial on October 4, 2024, by Magistrate Gunn who misused her Authority by refused to grant the default Judgement; further tampered with her attending her uncle's funeral service. Magistrate Grim decision added extreme pressure that could have affected her Mental health, it is human cruelty to have her human rights violate in such away.

1. Hearing for default Judgment was set on October 4, 2024. The magistrate misused her authority to refuse default judgment and demand that Ms. Lovell Marriott submit an appeal to the Grand Court because there is another law that overrides the 14-day law in the plaint.
2. It's against her human being to be treated unjustly because she is a litigant in person. Ms. Marriott refused to appeal to the Grand Court because she did not write the Cayman Islands Law. The law in the plaint is very simple and clear; she spoke to the Hon. Chief Justice regarding the matter reminding her it's her right to see that she receives the default Judgement without appealing to the Grand Court.
3. Ms. Marriott staged a Protest outside the Kirk House building on October 7 seeking justice. On October 8, 2024, she was arrested for standing in her legal rights to Protest and pray. Her bail bond illegally blocked her from continuing with protest before the Courthouse.
4. Ms. Lovell Marriott took out a Lawyer suit against the Attorney General and Commissioner of Police on August 22, 2024. They submitted a defense outside of the window given in the plaint. She was served a defense on September 9, 2024.
5. A default judgment application was filed against the Attorney General and Commissioner of Police to the Civil Registry on September 10, 2024, and set for a hearing on October 4, 2024.
