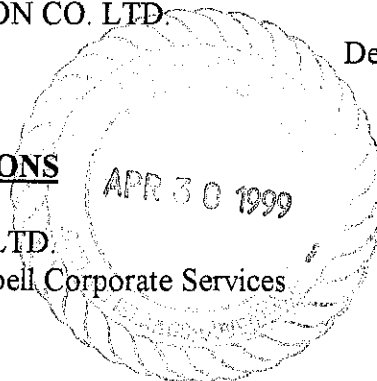

WRIT OF SUMMONS

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within 14 days after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgment without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice

NOTE- This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.

STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. The Plaintiff is a corporation incorporated pursuant to the laws of the State of Washington, United States.
2. The Defendant is a corporation incorporated pursuant to the laws of The Cayman Islands and having its registered office at Campbell Corporate Services, P.O. Box 260 GT, George Town, Grand Cayman.
3. In or about April of 1998, the Defendant entered into a verbal agreement with the Plaintiff whereby the Plaintiff would supply a tradesman experienced in the application of commercial insulation.
4. It was an express or, further and in the alternative, an implied term of the agreement that:
 - a. The Plaintiff would supply a tradesman experienced in the application of commercial insulation;
 - b. The Defendant would pay to the Plaintiff the following sums:
 - i. Cdn\$67.00 per hour for each hour of labour supplied and travel time (Vancouver, Canada to Cayman Islands and return) incurred by the tradesman;
 - ii. Air fare to transport the tradesman both to and from the Cayman Islands and Vancouver, British Columbia Canada;
 - c. The Defendant would provide accommodation for the tradesman while in the Cayman Islands such to include the cost of rented living accommodation, maintenance and utilities. The tradesman would pay for his own telephone expenses and meals.
 - d. The Defendant would promptly pay the Plaintiff for items as set out in paragraph 4b., above, and as set out in invoices rendered by the Plaintiff;
5. The Plaintiff complied with its duties under the agreement set out in paragraph 4 hereof and provided the Defendant with the agreed upon services in a professional and timely manner.

6. The Plaintiff rendered unto the Defendant the following invoices:

7. For expediency only, from the rendering of invoice 9802-02 to the rendering of the invoice 9802-04, the Plaintiff and Defendant agreed that the hourly rate of Cdn\$67.00 would be paid by the Defendant directly paying the tradesman the sum of Cdn\$40.00 and paying the Plaintiff the sum of Cdn\$27.00. The invoices rendered reflected this arrangement. At or about the time of the rendering of invoice 9802-05, the Defendant refused to make payment to the tradesman directly and, accordingly, the Plaintiff invoiced the Defendant again for the full sum of Cdn\$67.00 and the Plaintiff paid the tradesman from its own funds.
8. On or about June 17, 1998 the Defendant paid the Plaintiff the sum of Cdn\$17,522.77, being the total of invoices 9802-01, 9802-02 and 9802-03.
9. A total of Cdn\$8,270.50 remains due and owing.
10. The Plaintiff has demanded payment of the owed sum but the Defendant has refused to make payment.
11. The Defendant is indebted to the Plaintiff in the sum of Cdn\$8,270.50.
12. The Plaintiff also claims pre-judgment interest from June 13, 1998 on the sum of Cdn\$3,078.00 and pre-judgment interest from June 26, 1998 on the sum of Cdn\$5,192.50 by reason of the matter set out in paragraph 4(d) hereof.

AND THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS AGAINST THE DEFENDANT:

- A. The sum of Cdn\$8270.50;
- B. Pre-judgment interest upon the said sum pursuant to The Judicature Law (1995 Revision);
- C. Post-judgment interest upon the said sum pursuant to The Judicature Law (1995 Revision);
- D. Such further and other relief that this Honourable Court may deem just or appropriate.

E. Costs.

INDORSEMENT

The amount claimed in respect of the debt or demand is Cdn\$8270.50 as principal and Cdn\$488.66 as interest until the issue of the writ of summons for a total amount of Cdn\$8759.16. The amount of the fixed costs is CI\$500.00 and the costs of issuing the writ of summons is CI\$100.00. If, within the time for returning the acknowledgement of service, the defendant pays the plaintiff or its attorneys-at-law the total amount claimed in principal and interest, the fixed costs and the costs of issuing the writ of summons, further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the plaintiff or to its attorneys-at-law.

STATEMENT REGARDING INTEREST

- i. The prescribed rate of interest, throughout the relevant period, was 7 per cent per annum until December 31, 1998 and, thereafter, 6.75 per cent per annum;
- ii. The date from which interest is calculated is June 13, 1998 with regard to Cdn\$3078.00 of the principal sum claimed and June 26, 1998 with regard to Cdn\$5192.50 of the principal sum claimed;
- iii. The total interest claimed as at the date of the issue of the writ of summons is Cdn\$ 488.66;
- iv. The amount of interest accruing each day following the issue of the writ is Cdn\$1.53.

Notes on address for service

Attorney: when the Defendant is represented by an attorney, state the attorney's place of business in the Cayman Islands. A Defendant may not act by a foreign attorney.

Defendant in person: where the Defendant is acting in person, he must give his post office box number and the physical address of his residence or, if he does not reside in the Cayman Island, he must give an address in grand Cayman where communications for him should be sent. In the case of a limited company, "residence" means its registered principal office.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS

1. The accompanying form of Acknowledgment of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. 495GT, George Town, Grand Cayman.
2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgment of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings must also serve a defence on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in Person)

If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant

If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A Stay of Execution against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgement of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgment, but he must, within that time, issue a Summons for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by installments or otherwise.

Notes for guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessarily (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes " box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgment of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is used in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)".
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorized to act on behalf for the Company, but the Company cannot take any further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
8. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian ad litem.
9. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office
