WRIT OF SUMMONS

TO: Calvin B. Tibbetts as administrator of the Estate of Nada Elvena Bodden, 2109 Island Lake Circle, Panama City, Florida 32405.

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within 14 days after the service of the Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, PO Box 495GT, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the

proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

NOTE - This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.

### PARTICULARS OF CLAIM

1. The Plaintiff is the sister-in-law of the deceased Mrs. Nada Elvena Bodden of Cayman Brac and a creditor of the estate in her personal capacity and as Administratrix of the estate of Levin Benson Tibbetts.
2. The Defendant is the Administrator of the estate of Nada Elvena Bodden by virtue of an order of the Grand Court made on 9 April 1999.
3. The Plaintiff and her husband Mr Benson Tibbetts, incurred numerous debts in relation to Nada Bodden
4. Mrs. Nada Bodden was the sister of Mr Tibbetts and from 1979 until her death in January 1996 was financially assisted by Mr. Tibbetts.
5. For the last two years of her life Mrs. Bodden suffered from Alzheimer's disease and required constant care. In May 1995 she was admitted to the Faith Hospital. While there she suffered a cerebra vascular accident which left her in a vegetative state. She remained in the hospital until her death in January 1996.
6. The Plaintiff and her husband paid for all the utility bills for Mrs. Nada including insurance on the house. They made provision for meals to be delivered to her, for which they paid as well as the expense of the caregivers.
7. The Plaintiff paid the entire medical bills and funeral expenses for Mrs Nada Bodden.
8. The estate of Nada Bodden consists of several parcels of land located in Cayman Brac. The Plaintiff therefore claims reimbursement for the expenses, which she incurred from the proceeds of the sale of these properties.
9. The Plaintiff claims for reimbursement of utility bills, cost of insurance of Ms Bodden's home, cost of the care givers, and all medical and funeral expenses.

10. The Plaintiff prays that an inhibition be placed on the properties in the estate of Nada Bodden until the hearing of Writ of Summons.
11. Costs be awarded to the Plaintiff.

## DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE OF WRIT OF SUMMONS

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person.

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

2. A Defendant who states in his *Acknowledgment of Service* that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiffs (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiffs may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the *Acknowledgment of Service*, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his *Acknowledgment*, but he must, within that time, *issue a Summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by instalments or otherwise.

## Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.

In the case of a limited company, "residence" means its registered or principal office.
