

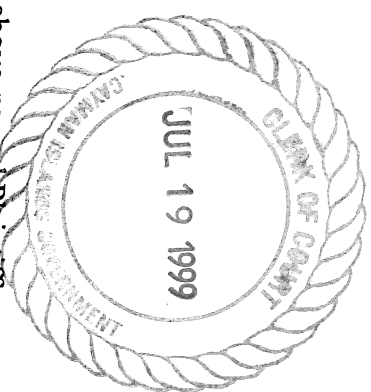
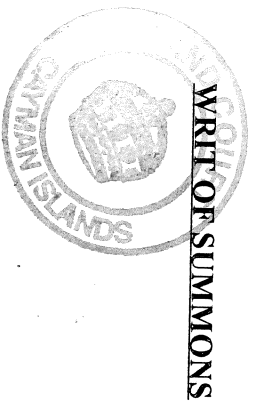

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of a claim set out the next page.

Within fourteen (14) days after service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O.Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgement may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

NOTE - This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.

SPECIAL INDORSEMENT

1. In or about August, 1993 the Plaintiff agreed to sell a piece of land known as Parcel 93 Block 53A in North Side, Old Man Bay to the Defendants for the sum of \$25,000.00.
2. On or about the 18th July, 1994, at the request of the Defendants, the Plaintiff, signed a transfer of the property to the Defendants with the agreement that they would take the transfer to the bank and obtain a loan to pay the Plaintiff.
3. In breach of the agreement the defendant failed to obtain the loan and pay the Plaintiffs and as a result, by letter written and delivered about the 9th March, 1995, the Plaintiff demanded payment of the full amount from the Defendants within 10 days, failing which legal action would be commenced against them.
5. On the 10th March, 1995 the Defendants paid the Plaintiff \$5,000.00 and promised to pay the balance within 45 days. However, in breach of that agreement the Defendants have paid only \$10,000.00 by 2 instalments of \$5,000.00 each in or about April and May, 1995. Since then, despite numerous demands and promises, the Defendants have made no more payments and the sum of \$10,000.00 is still due and owing.

WHEREFORE THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS:

1. Balance of the sale price \$10,000.00
2. Interest from 18th July, 1994 to 19th July, 1999

at 7 1/2% per annum = \$10,000.00 x .075 x 1826/365

\$ 3,752.00

3. Further interest at the rate of 7.5 % p.a
from 20/7/99 until payment
4. Costs to be taxed or agreed.
