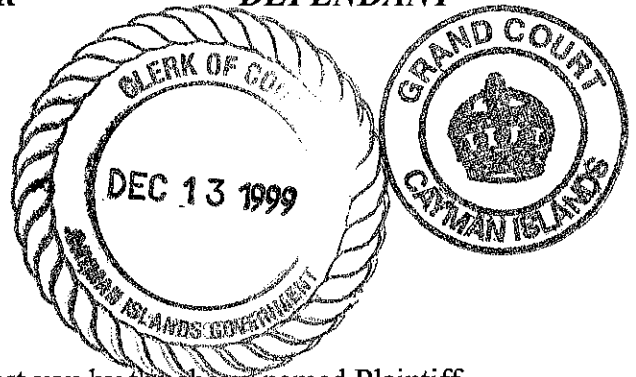

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within fourteen (14) days after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgment without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

Issued this 13 day of Dec. 1999.

NOTE - This Writ may not be served later than four (4) calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, six (6) months) beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.

STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. The Plaintiff is at all material times a firm of Attorneys-at-law. The Defendant is at all material times a client of the Plaintiff.
2. By an oral agreement made on or around October, 1998, between the Plaintiff and the Defendant, ("the agreement"), it was agreed that in consideration of the Plaintiff advising and representing him in a case before this Honourable Court and assigned the number Cause No. 585 of 1998, the Defendant would pay the Plaintiff at the rate of CI\$225.00 per hour for its services, and pay for any disbursements incurred.
3. Pursuant to the agreement, the Plaintiff drafted various documents related to the Defendant's case, consulted in person and on the telephone with the Defendant and Court Officers, Attended and appeared at Court, Prepared for appearances in Court, Drafted a Court order, Filed a Court order, and appeared in an application before a Judge in Chambers.
4. On the 9th of July, 1999 the Plaintiff by its partner Mr. James Samuel Jackson delivered to the Defendant by post a fee-note in the amount of CI\$2208.75, representing nine and three-quarters (9 $\frac{3}{4}$) hours of work, plus CI\$15.00 in disbursements.
5. On the 6th of September, 1999, the Plaintiff delivered by post a letter of reminder to the Defendant, as the fee- note referred to in paragraph 5 remained unsettled.
6. In breach of the said agreement, and despite the matters referred to in paragraphs 4 and 5, the Defendant has failed to settle the said fee-note.

AND THE PLAINTIFF claims:

1. The said amount of CI\$2208.75;
2. Interest of CI\$73.48 in pursuant to S.34 of the Judicature Law (1995 Revision) and Rules 4 & 5 of the Judgment Debts (Rates of Interest) Rules 1995;
3. Costs.

If, within the time for returning the Acknowledgment of Service, the Defendant pays the total amount claimed of CI\$2457.23 (including interest and costs) further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the Plaintiff.
