STATEMENT OF CLAIM



1. The Government of the Cayman Islands ("Government") was at all material times the owner in possession of land and premises known as West Bay North West Block 1E, Parcel 46. The Defendant is and was at all material times the occupier of adjoining land and premises known as West Bay North West Block 1E, Parcel 6.
2. In the latter part of 1998 the Defendant his servants or agents wrongfully built a wall on the Government's said land.
3. By reason of the matters aforesaid the Government has suffered loss and damage.
4. By letter from the Department of Lands and Survey dated 31st March 1999 the Government requested the Defendant to remove the said wall but the Defendant has failed or refused to do so.



And the Plaintiff claims:

- (1) An order that the Defendant do forthwith pull down and remove the said wall;
- (2) Damages;
- (3) Further or other relief.
