LET THE DEFENDANT attend before the Judge in Chambers, at the Law Courts, George Town, Grand Cayman on the 29 day of MARCH 2000, at 9:30 o'clock on the hearing of an application by the Plaintiff for the following orders:

1. That this Honorable Court doth sanction and permit the sale by private treaty of all that land and property registered in the Cayman Islands Land Register and being particularly known as Registration Section Spotts, Block 24 Parcel 220 ("the Property") by the Plaintiff as Chargee with a power of sale over the Property.
2. That the Defendants and any other person occupying the Property do, within 28 days of this Order, vacate the Property and take all appropriate steps to give the Plaintiff vacant possession of the Property.
3. That this Honourable Court shall give directions with regard to the price for the sale of the Property.
4. Such further or other relief as this Honourable Court may deem appropriate.

LET THE DEFENDANTS, within 14 days after service of this Summons on them, counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service to the Courts Office, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgment of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
