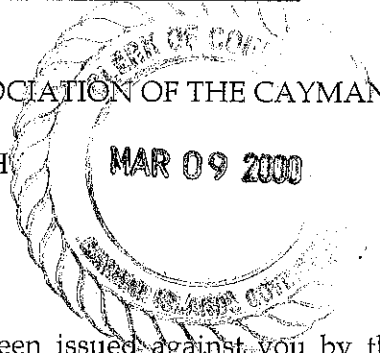

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiffs in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within Fourteen days [14] after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O. Box 495, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiffs may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

Issued this 9th day of March 2000.

NOTE - This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.

STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. The Plaintiffs are the Joint Official Liquidators ("the Liquidators") of First Cayman Bank Ltd. (In Liquidation) ("the Bank"), whose address is P.O. Box 1113, George Town, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands. The Bank has at all material times has lent money to the Defendant.
2. The Defendant's address is P.O. Box 30540, Seven Mile Beach, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands and the Defendant was at all material times the recipient of money lent by the Bank.
3. The Defendant maintained a chequing account, number 210-108-195, with the Bank and on or about 17th December 1996 the Bank agreed to extend an overdraft facility to the Defendant of US\$30,000.00 on the said chequing account, which the Defendant agreed to repay. The facility was subject to normal banking terms and conditions including the right to repayment on demand.
4. The said facility is contained in or is evidenced by a memorandum signed by the Defendant and dated 17th December 1996. It was also an express term of the facility that the Defendant would pay interest on the amount of the said loan at the rate of 15% per annum.
5. Pursuant to the overdraft facility, on 17th December 1996 the Plaintiffs paid to the Defendant by way of allowing the current account to go into overdraft.
6. The Defendant has repaid the Bank the total sum of US\$35,171.97 on account of the said overdraft:

7. Since 10th September 1997 the Defendant has made no further payments. As a result, the Plaintiffs claim the sum of US\$7,847.12, being the balance due on the overdraft facility, including interest which has accrued thereon.

AND THE PLAINTIFFS CLAIM:

1. The said sum of US\$7,847.12 being the outstanding balance of monies including interest of an overdraft facility extended to the Defendant by the Plaintiff on 17th December 1996 which remains due and owing.
2. The Plaintiffs claim further interest on the said sum as aforesaid from the date hereof until judgment or sooner payment at the daily rate of US\$3.22.
3. Alternatively, the Plaintiffs claim pre-judgment interest pursuant to Section 34 of the Judicature Law (1995 revision) as follows:
 - (i) At the rate of 7½% from 17th December 1996 to 31st January 1998;
 - (ii) At the rate of 7½% from 1st February 1998 to 31st December 1998; and
 - (iii) At the rate of 7% from 1st January 1999 to the date of this Writ.
4. Further and alternatively the Plaintiffs claim interest at the rate of 7% pursuant to Section 34 of the Judicature Law (1995 Revision) from the date hereof until judgment or sooner payment.
5. Costs.

If within the time for returning Acknowledgment of Service the Defendant pays the total amount claimed of CIS\$7,847.12 (excluding the costs of any additional interest accruing) further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the offices of the Plaintiffs' Attorneys-at-Law.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgement of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiffs (or on the Plaintiffs if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiffs may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgement of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgement, but he must, within that time, *issue a Summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by instalments or otherwise.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a **FIRM** and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a **PARTNER** by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual **TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN**, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a **LIMITED COMPANY** the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authroised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on his behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a **MINOR** or a **MENTAL PATIENT**, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
